*Survey of Canadians*



June 1st, 2026



# Methodology

This week, we surveyed Canadians on politics, government performance, and key national issues.

## Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.  
(Canadian sample: **n= 1,532**)

Respondents had the option of completing the survey in French and English and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.

## Weighting

Results were weighted according to **age, gender, mother tongue, region, education and presence of children in the household** in order to ensure a representative sample of the Canadian population.

## When

Data collection from **May 29 to June 1, 2026**.

## Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than **±2.50%**, (19 times out of 20) for the sample.

## Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion than that of other respondents.

## Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

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## Key Highlights

Some of **the key highlights** of our survey...

### **FEDERAL VOTING INTENTIONS**

- The Liberals continue to lead nationally with 50% support among decided voters (+2 points since April), while the Conservatives stand at 34% (-3 points). Support for the NDP (6%), Bloc Québécois (6%) and Greens (3%) remains largely unchanged.
- 50% support for the Liberals is the highest this government has achieved in Leger's polling of popular support since it was elected in 2015. Its previous high was 49% in February 2016.

### **GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE**

- Half of Canadians (54%) are satisfied with the federal government led by Mark Carney, compared to 37% who are dissatisfied. Satisfaction remains strongest among Quebecers (61%), Canadians aged 55 and older (64%) and Liberal voters (91%).

### **PRIME MINISTER CARNEY**

- More than half of Canadians (56%) approve of Mark Carney's performance as Prime Minister, while 34% disapprove. Approval is once again highest among Quebecers (63%), older Canadians (67%) and Liberal voters (93%).

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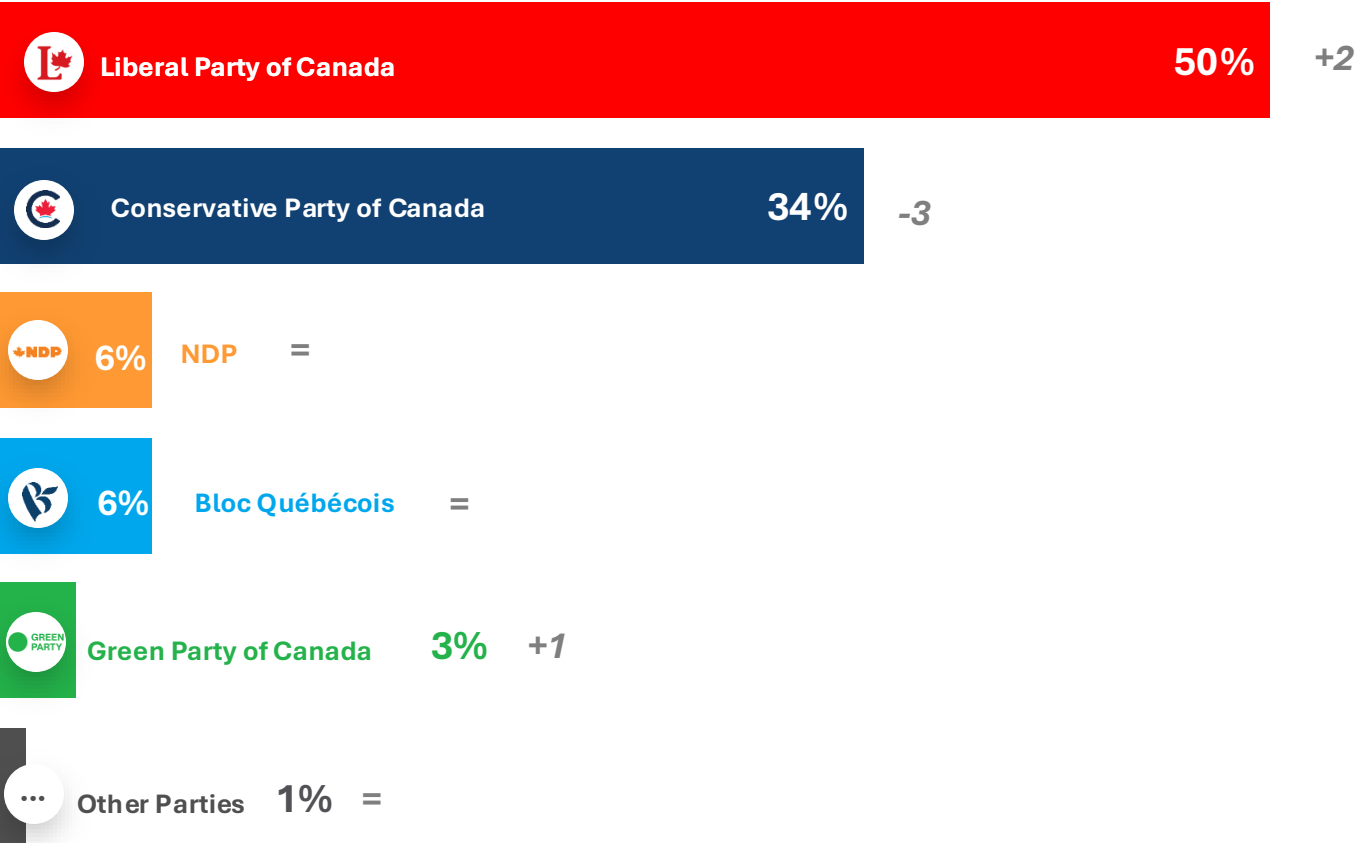

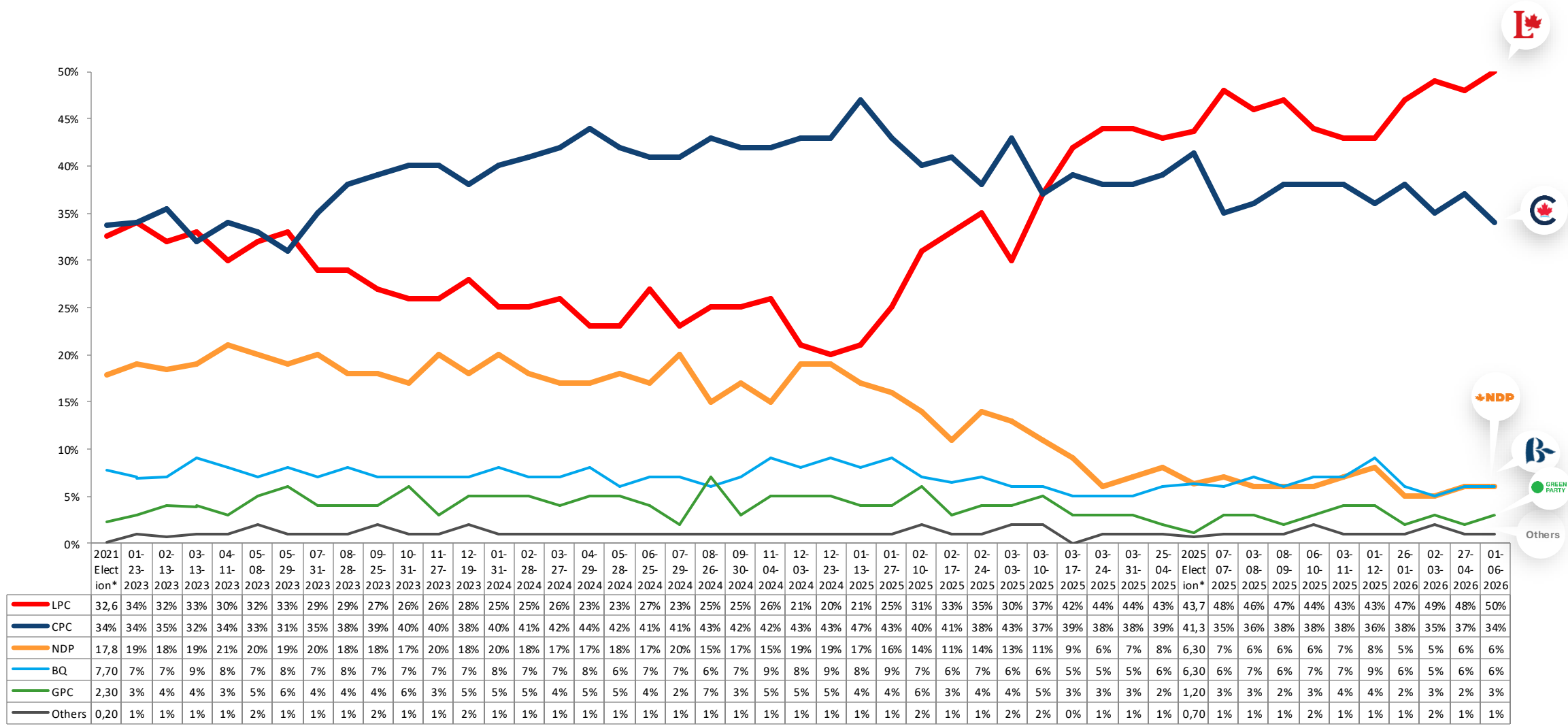

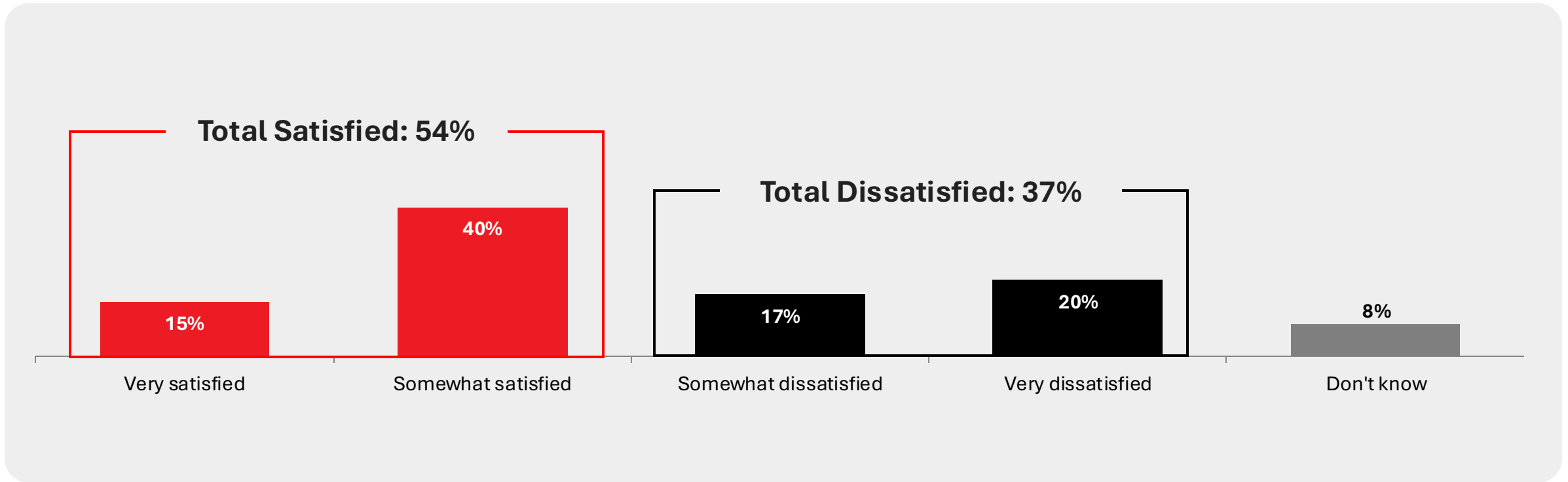

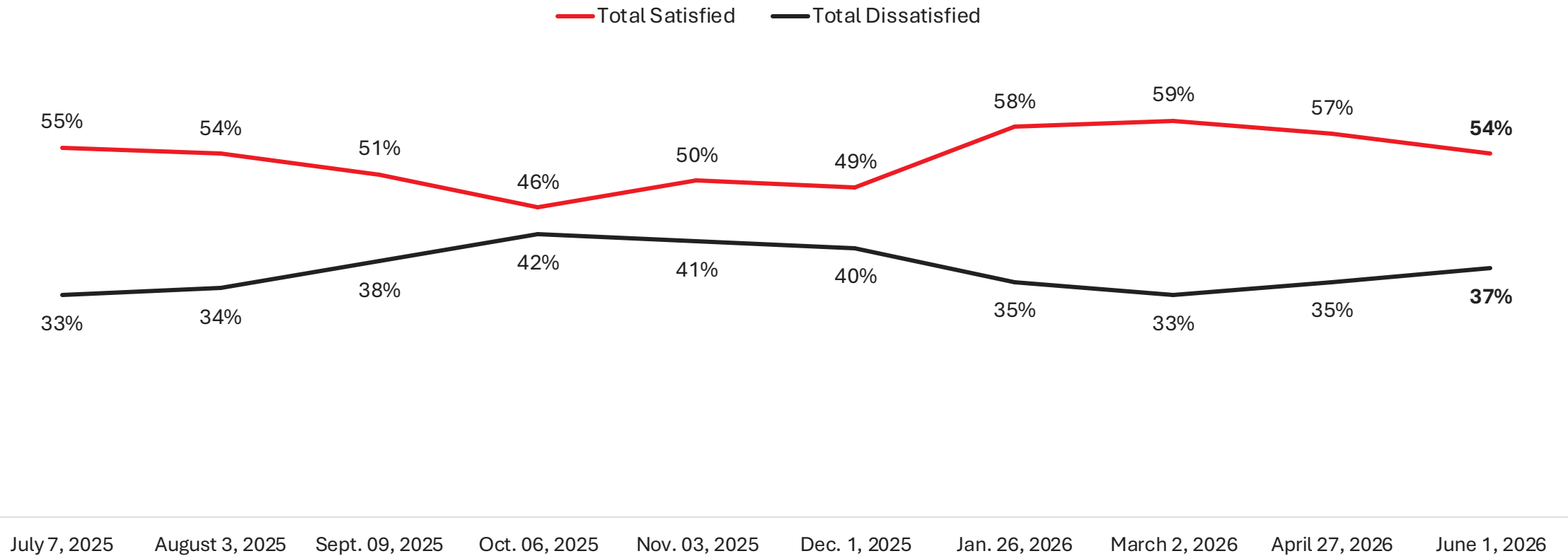

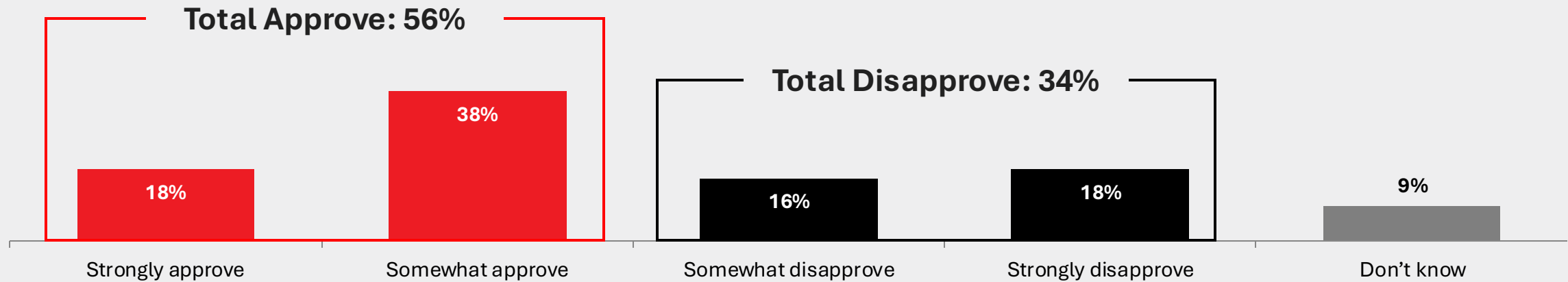

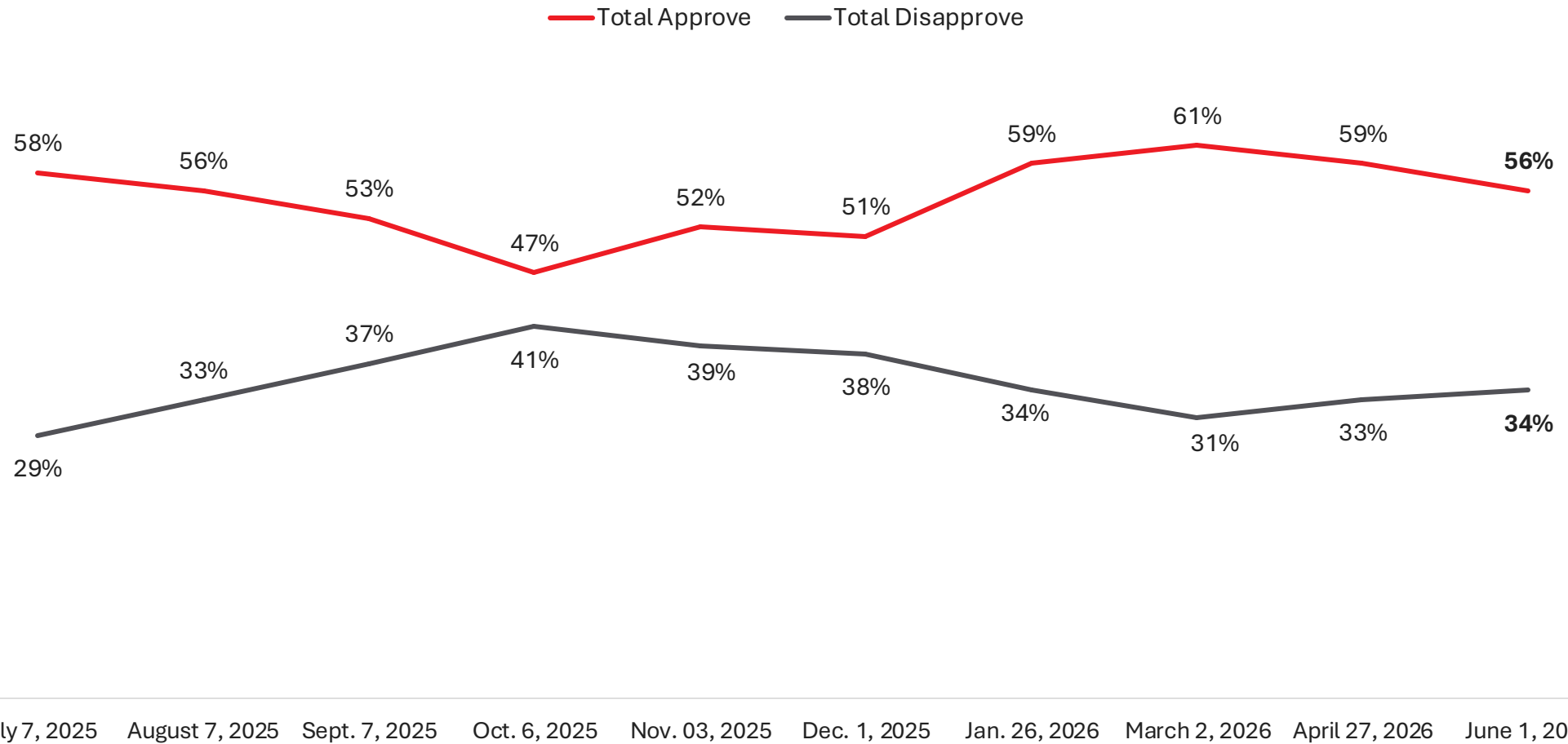
