How Canadians Perceive Volunteer Work

Report



1.0 Study Highlights

- Most Canadians do volunteer work.

Question : *In the past 12 months, have you volunteered...?*

- At least one day a month is spent volunteering.

2. Detailed Results

2.1 Most Canadians do volunteer work

58% of Canadians spend part of their free time doing volunteer work, compared to 41% who don't.

Women (61%), over-65s (61%), Prairie residents (67%), Albertans (65%), high income earners (66%), retirees (62%), professionals (69%), and university graduates (72%) do the most volunteer work.

Note : The 100% complement represents those who don't know or who refuse to answer.

33% do volunteer work that involves providing support to different groups of people (children, the elderly, women in difficulty) while 21% say they volunteer in the area of sports and leisure, 16% in social work (associations), 16% in the health sector, 13% in cultural activities, 6% defending human rights and 15% in other areas.

2.2 At least one day a month is spent volunteering

Canadian volunteers spend an average of over 10 hours a month doing volunteer work.

37% do under 5 hours, 25% between 5 and 9 hours, 20% between 10 and 19 hours, 8% between 20 and 29 hours and 7% more than 30 hours a month of volunteer work.

The time spent doing volunteer work varies according to the availability of people. Those over 55 and homemakers do an average of 13 days per month, while 25-44 year olds do an average of 9 days per month.

Canadians who volunteer in the field of sports and leisure do more hours of volunteer work on average (11.7 hours/month) than those who volunteer in other areas. Volunteers in the field of social work seem to spend the least amount of time on average (8.7 hours/month).

Note : The data is based on the first answer given in response to the question relating to which field the volunteer work was done.

2.3 Volunteer work: a personal decision to help others

57% of Canadians first decided on their own to do volunteer work, while 22% responded to a request, 11% did so because family members or friends did so and 8% for less quantifiable reasons.

69% of those over 55 acted out of a personal decision, compared to 17% who responded to a request.

Canadians volunteer in order to help others (52%), to give back some of what they've received (37%), to do a favour (20%), to feel a sense of worth (19%), to meet people (11%), out of duty (10%) and to make friends (7%).

2.4 Over a third of volunteers would be willing to go abroad to volunteer

36% of volunteers say they are ready to do volunteer work abroad, while 61% say they wouldn't be interested.

53% of 18-24 year olds and 55% of students are among those who would most like to go abroad.

2.5 Volunteer work is not sufficiently acknowledged by governments

71% of Canadians feel that volunteer work is not sufficiently acknowledged by governments, whereas 56% feel it is sufficiently recognised by the general public.

3.0 Methodology

This study was conducted by Leger Marketing through telephone interviews among a representative sample of 1529 English- or French-speaking Canadians, 18 years of age or older.

The interviews were conducted from our Montreal and Winnipeg call centres between December 3 and December 8, 2002. Up to ten call-backs were made in the case of non-response.

Using data from Statistics Canada, the results were weighted according to geographic location, gender and language spoken at home to ensure a sample representative of the entire Canadian adult population. In the end, the maximum margin of error obtained for a sample of 1529 respondents is of ± 2.5 , 19 times out of 20.
