# Methodology

#### **Study Population**

• Canadian residents, ages 18 and older.

#### **Data Collection**

- A total of n=1501 online surveys were conducted via Leger's online LEO panel.
- Interviews were conducted from June 30 to July 3, 2022

#### **Statistical Analysis**

- As a non-probability online survey, a margin of error is technically not to be reported.
- If the data were collected through a probability sample, the margin of error would be (n=1501) ±2.5%, 19 times out of 20.
- Using data from the 2021 Census, results were weighted according to age, gender, and region in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.
- The numbers presented have been rounded to the nearest whole number. However, raw values were used to calculate the sums presented and therefore may not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.






## Best Leader for the Conservative Party (Conservative Supporters Only)

Base: Conservative Party supporters (n=384)








## Over half of Canadians disapprove of the job Justin Trudeau is doing as PM








#### NDP voters' top 4:

#### Liberal voters' top 4:

- Integrity issues, such as the WE Foundation issue or the Jody Wilson-Raybould/SNC Lavlin Affair 24%
- Purchasing the Transmountain oil pipeline 13%
- Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples 6%
- Failed to keep his promises 5%

#### Conservative voters' top 4:

- Integrity issues, such as the WE Foundation issue or the Jody Wilson-Raybould/SNC Lavlin Affair – 19%
- Too much focus on style and too little on substance – 16%
- Failed to keep his promises 12%
- Invoking the Emergency Measures Act during the convoy protests – 11%


#### NDP voters' top 4:

- Failed to keep his promises 21%
- Integrity issues, such as the WE Foundation issue or the Jody Wilson-Raybould/SNC Lavlin Affair – 19%
- Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples 18%
- Purchasing the Transmountain oil pipeline 15%


