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METHODOLOGY

METHODOLOGICAL APPROACH



METHOD

A web-based survey was conducted with a representative sample of 1,527 Canadians and 1,006 Americans. Respondents had to be able to speak either English or French and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.



WHEN?

Data was collected from 17 to 19 March 2023.



MARGIN OF ERROR

Typically, a margin of error on a non-probability sample drawn from a panel is not provided, but for comparison, the margin of error for a sample of 1,527 respondents is $\pm 2.5\%$, 19 times out of 20 and a sample of 1,006 respondents is $\pm 3.1\%$, 19 times out of 20.



WEIGHTING

Results were weighted by gender, age, mother tongue, region, education and presence of children in the household to ensure a representative sample of the Canadian and U.S. population.



SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES

Numbers in **green** and **red** in the sub-group tables indicate greater significant difference from the overall.



ROUNDED DATA

Note that numbers have been rounded. However, numbers before rounding are used to calculate the amounts presented. Thus, the sums may not correspond to the manual addition of the numbers presented.

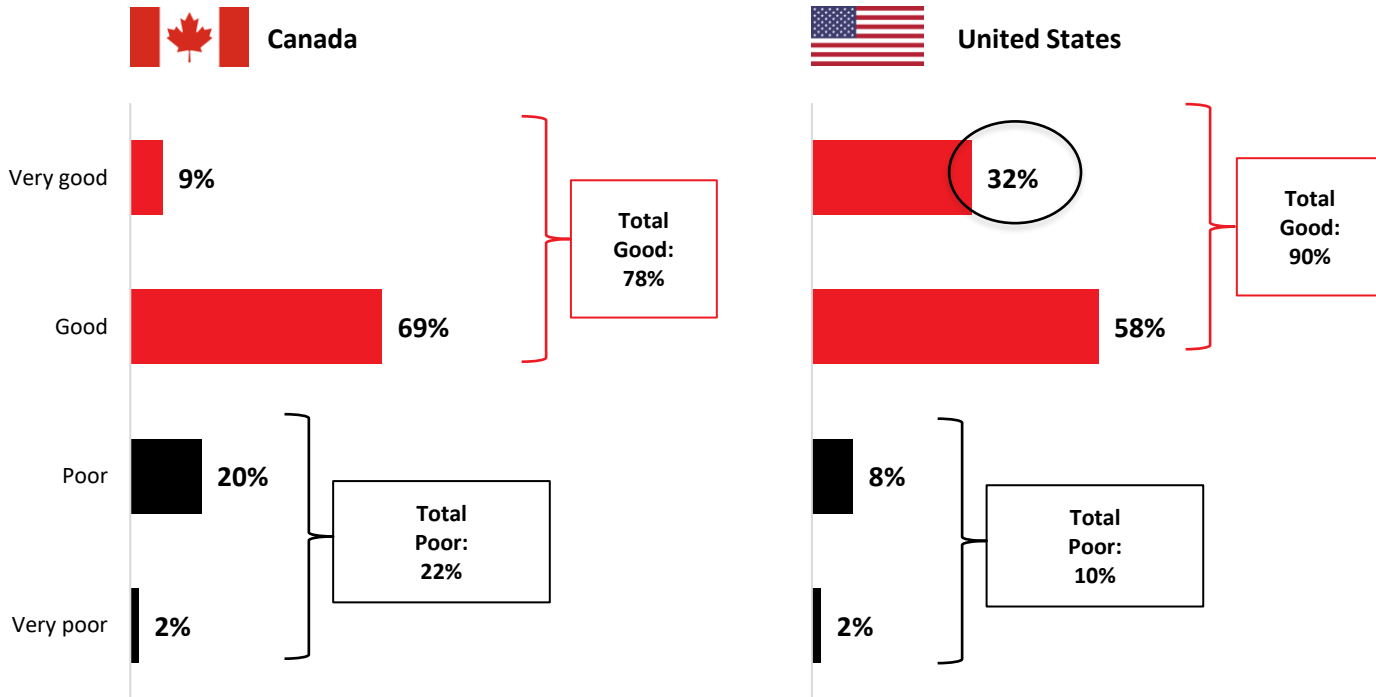

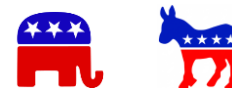

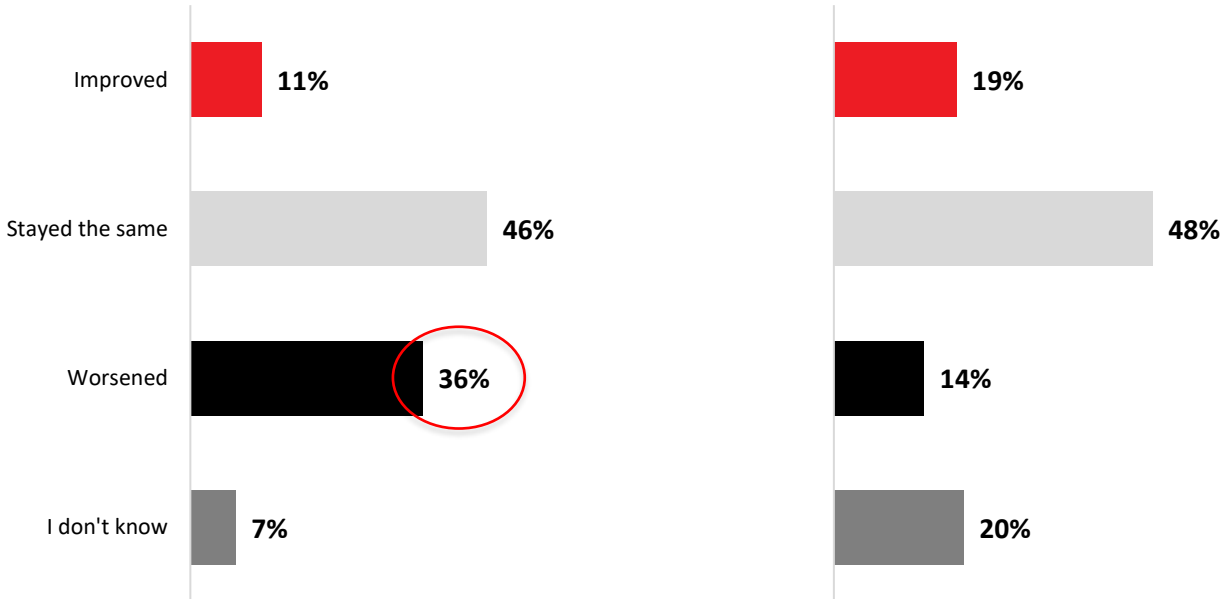

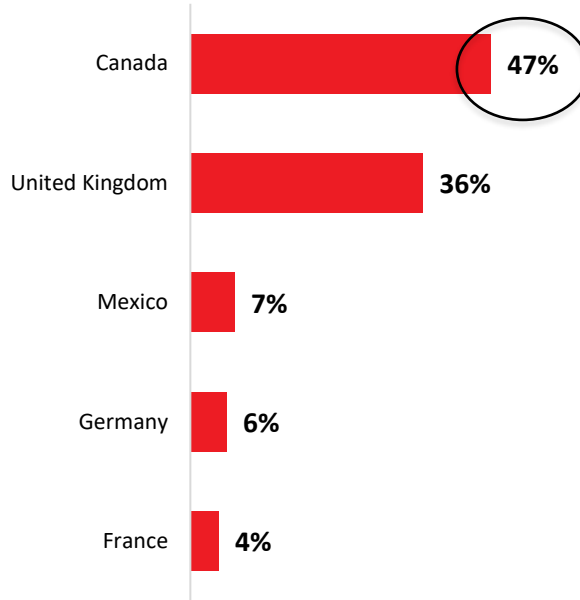
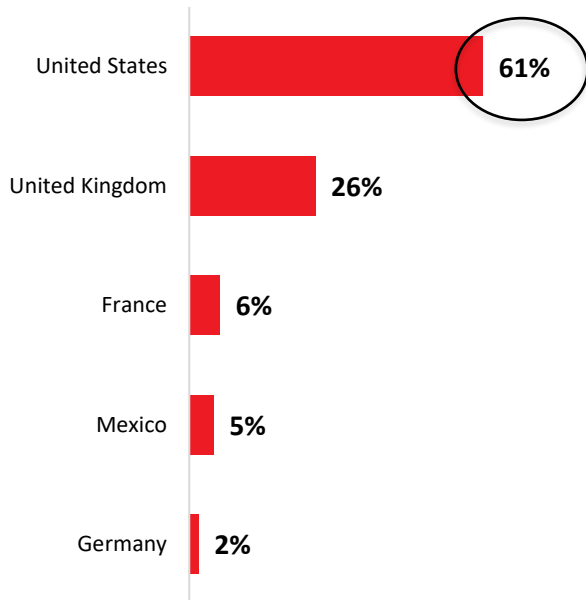

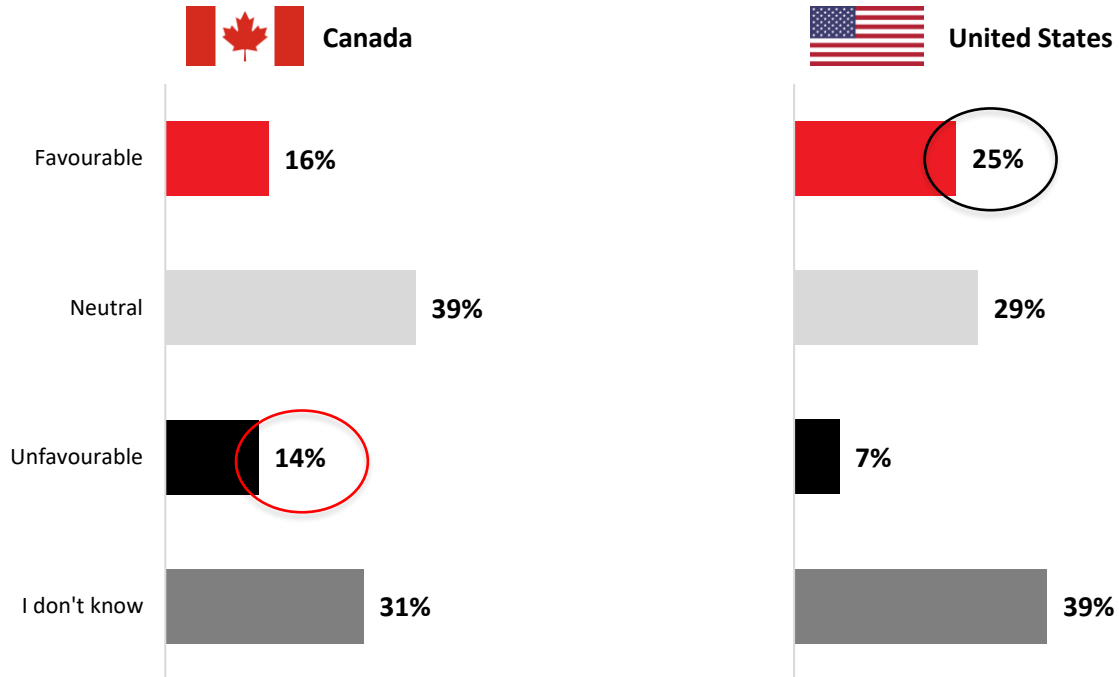

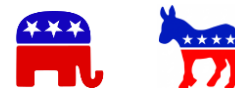

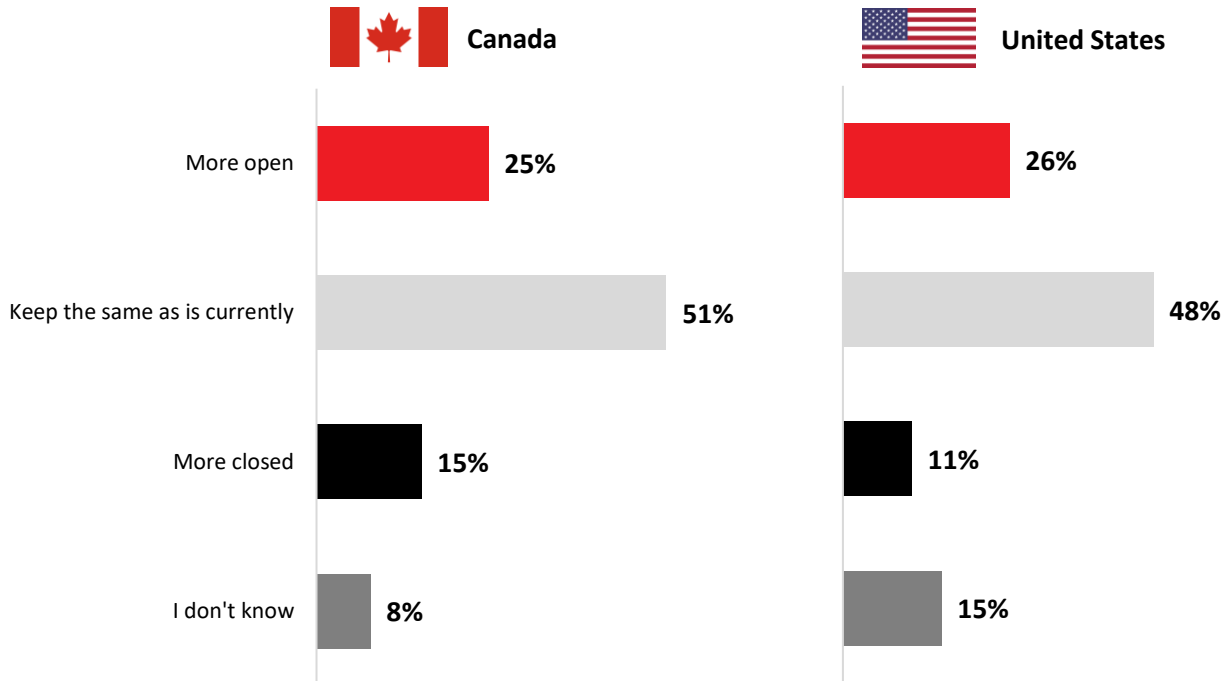

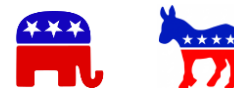

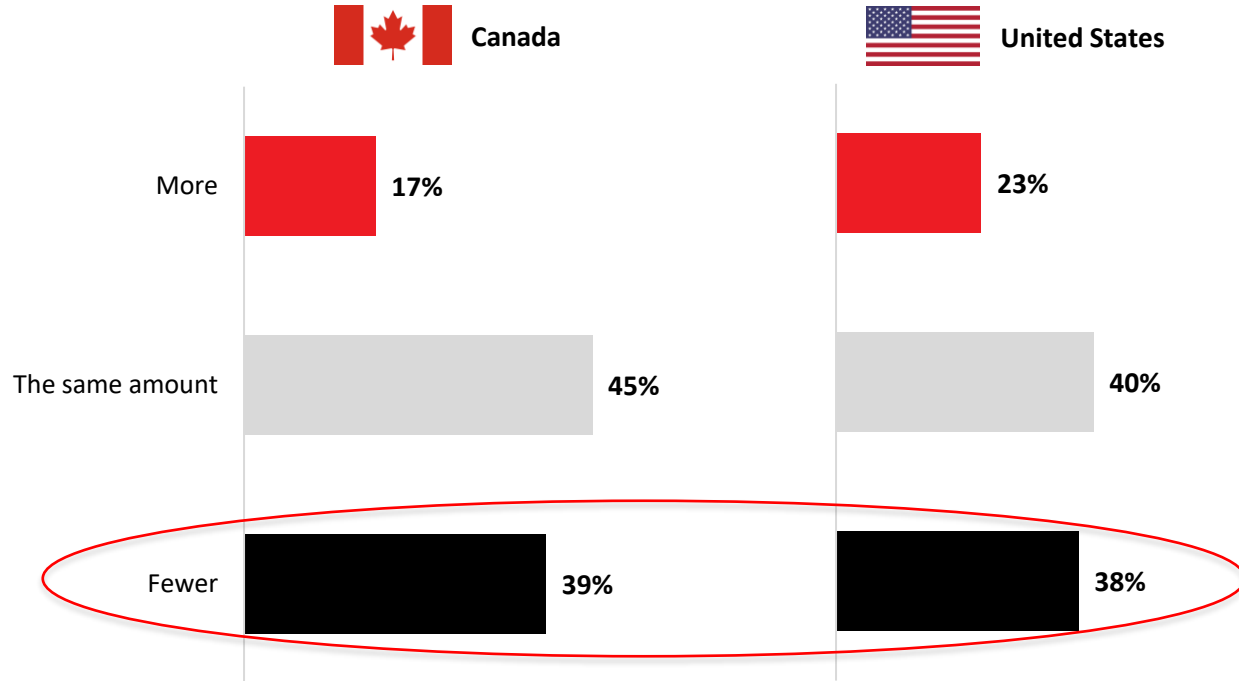

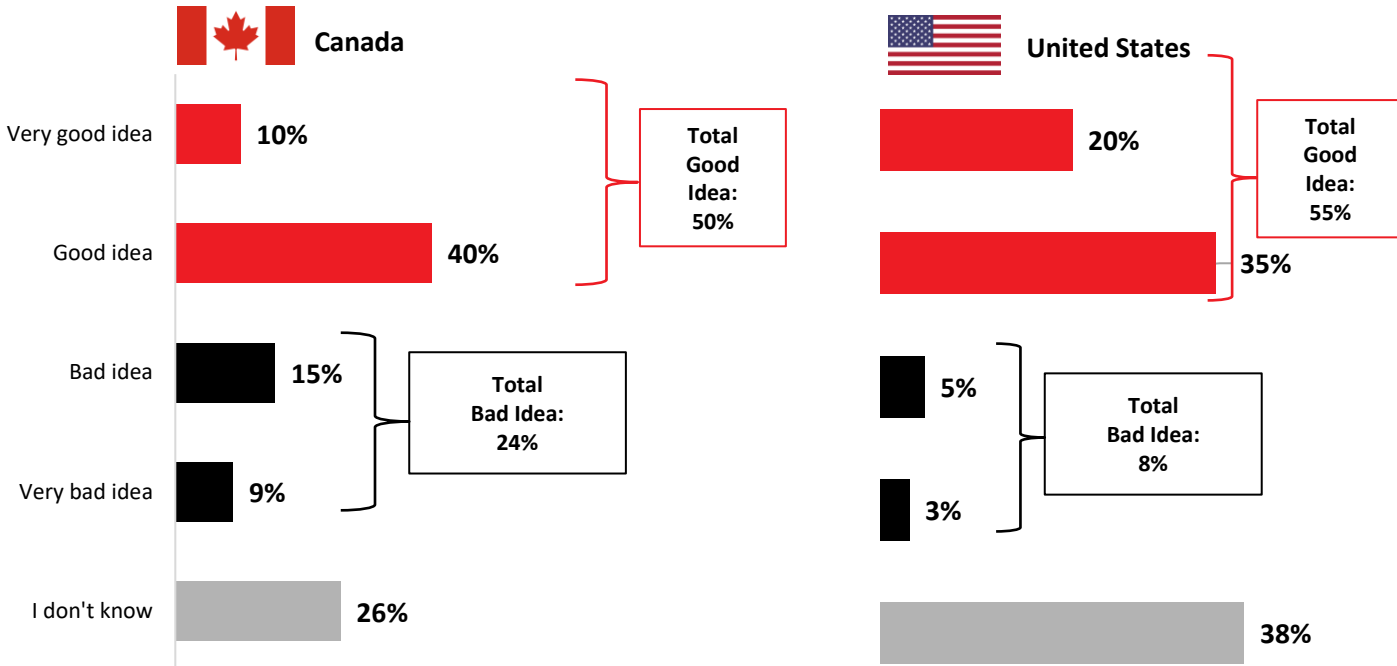

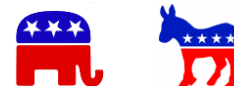

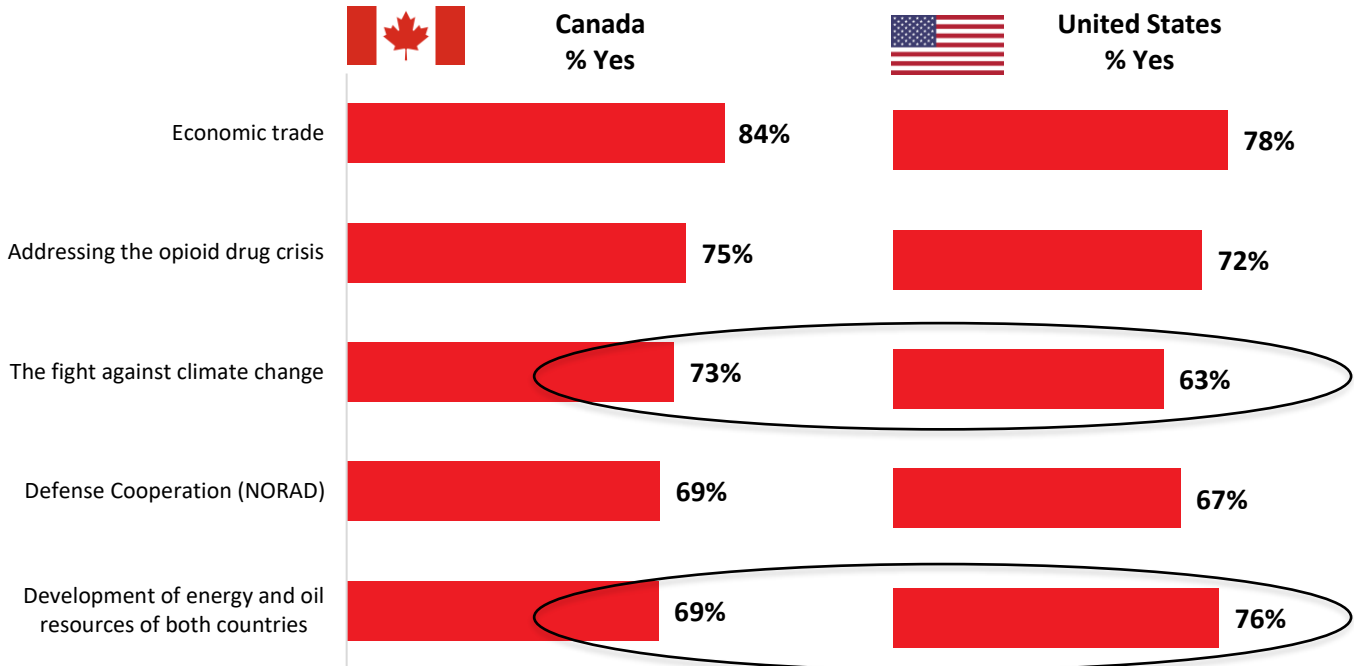

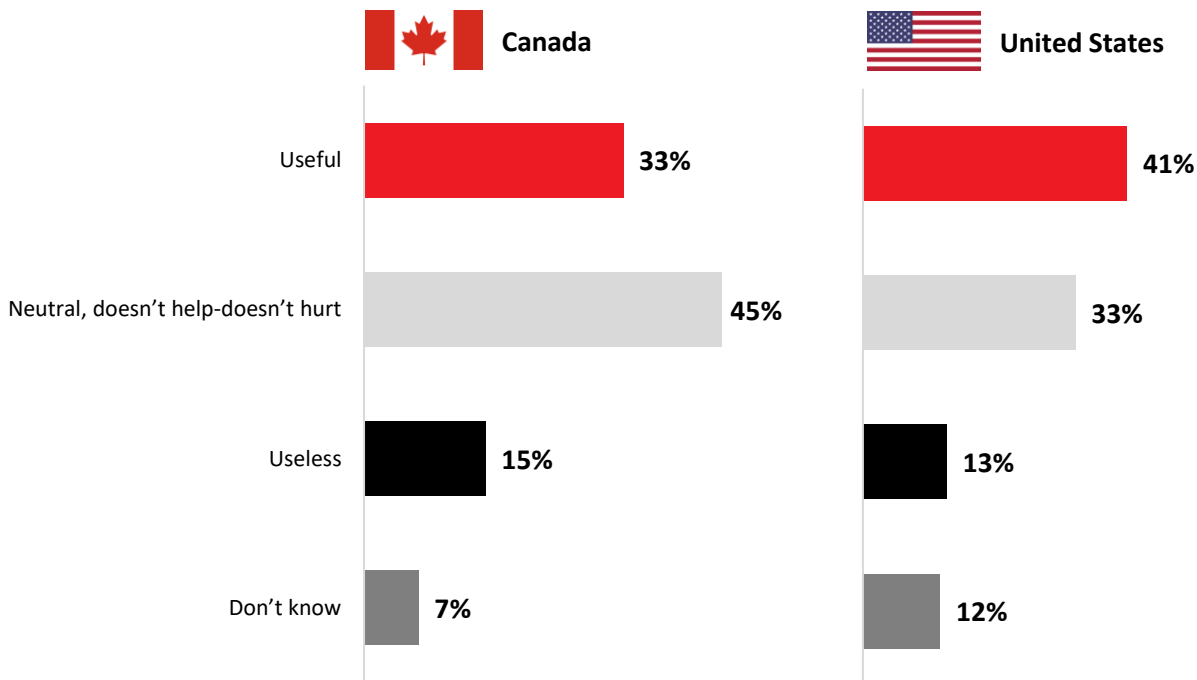

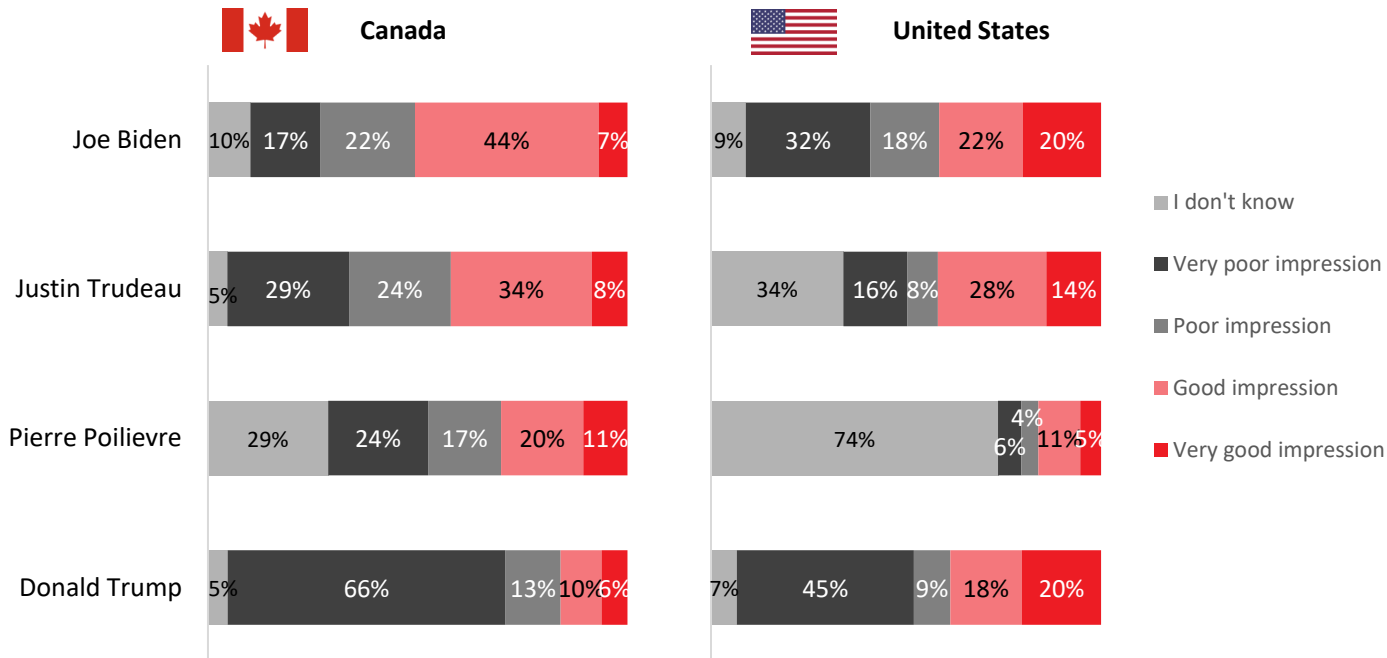

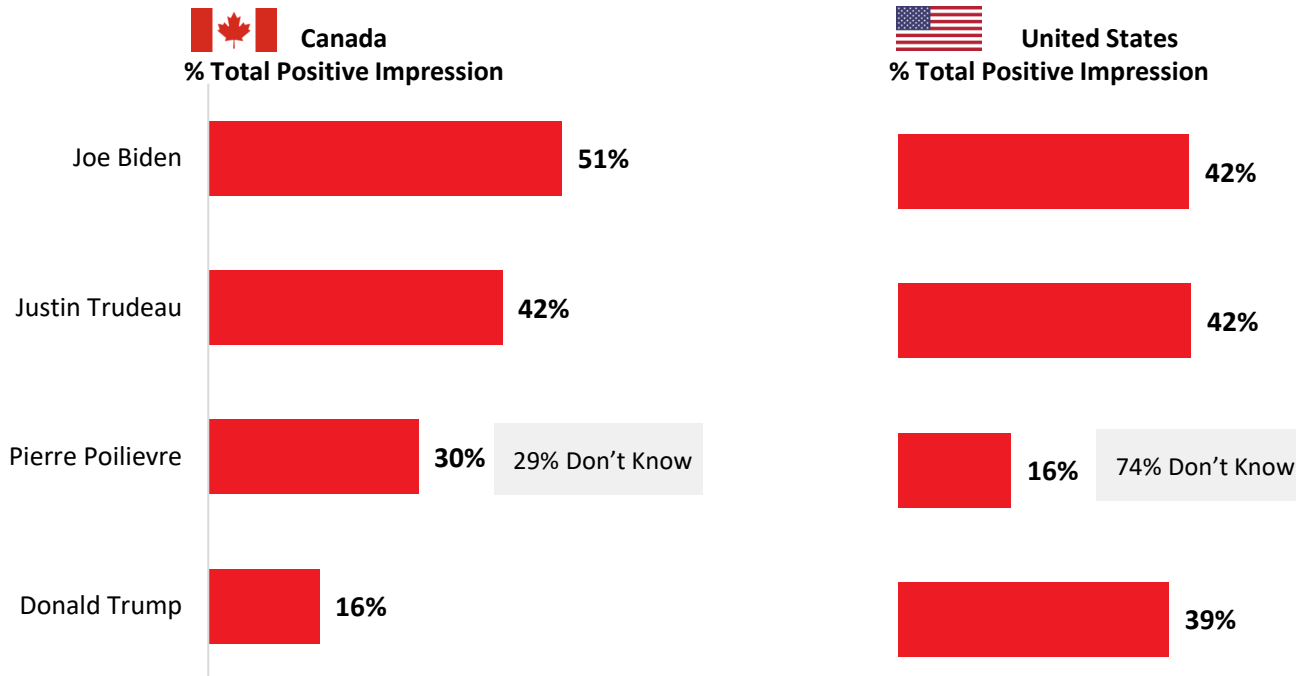

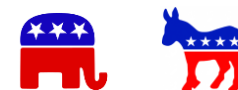

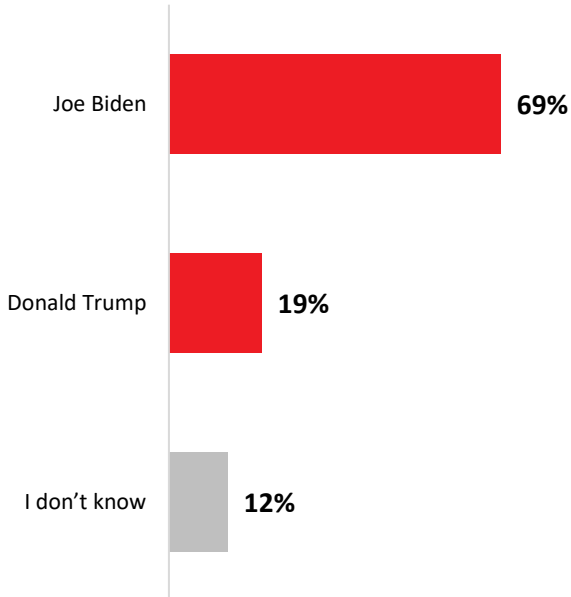
PREFERRED LEADER FOR THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRY

Q11. Would you prefer having Joe Biden or Donald Trump as President of the United States ?

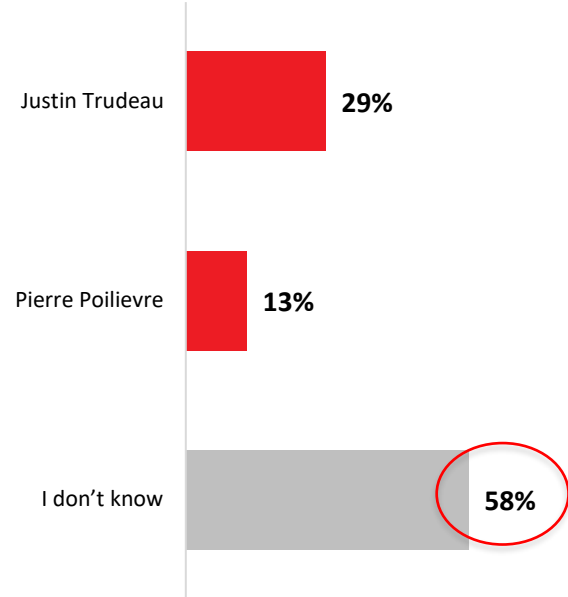

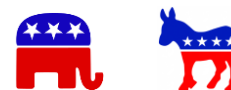

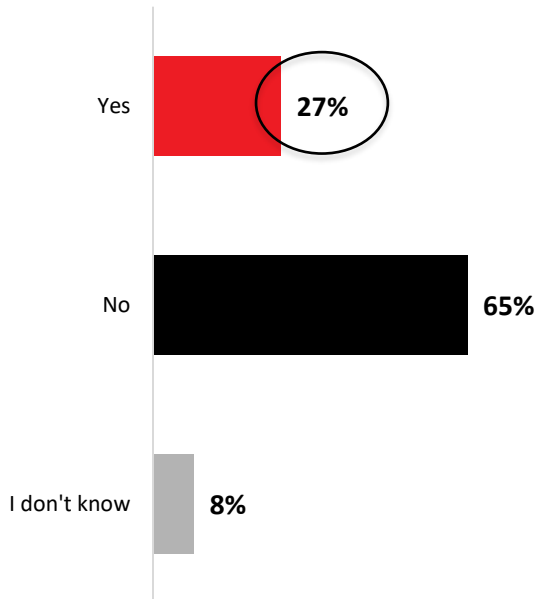

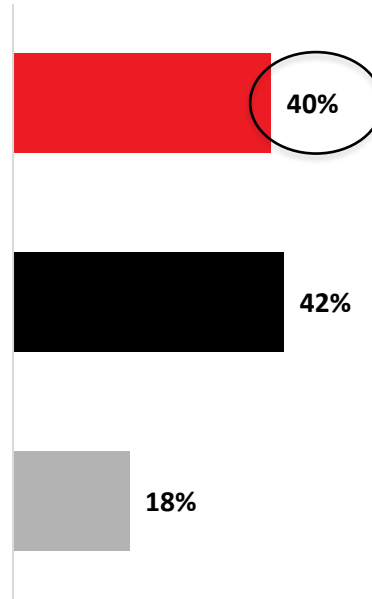

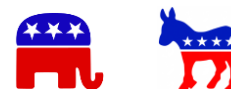

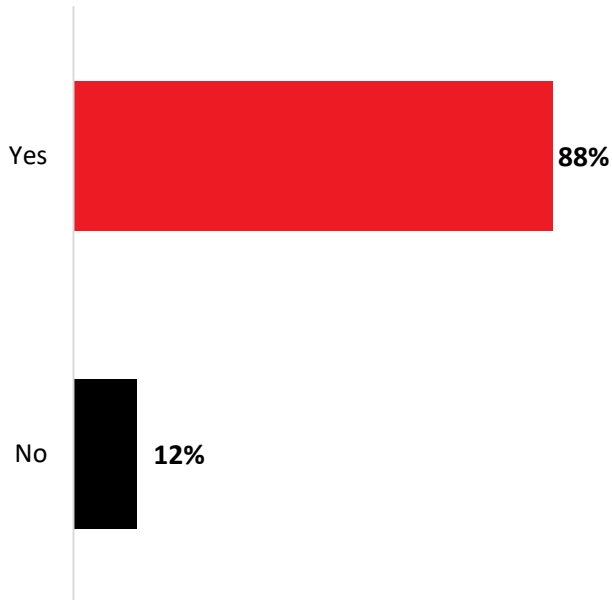

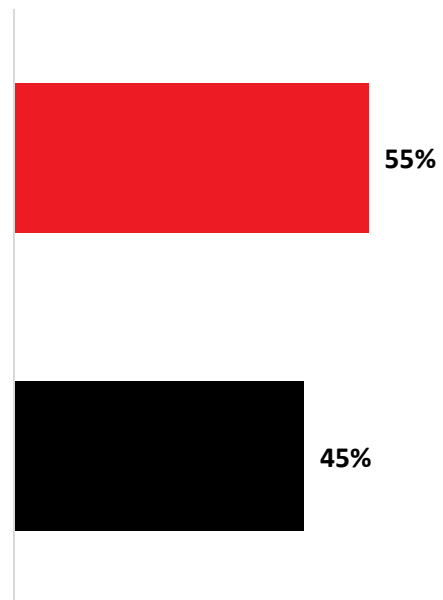

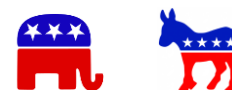
