METHOD

A web survey was conducted among 1,591 Canadians 18 years of age or older and eligible to vote in Canada. An oversample of 604 respondents from the province of Quebec was surveyed. Respondents had the option of completing the survey in English or in French and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.



WHEN ?

The data was collected from March 4th to March 6th, 2022.



MARGIN OF ERROR

No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However, for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1,591 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.5\%$, 19 times out of 20.



WEIGHTING

Results were weighted according to **gender, age, mother tongue, region, education and presence of children in the household** in order to ensure a representative sample of the Canadian population.



SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES

In this report, data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion than that of other respondents.



ROUNDED DATA

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

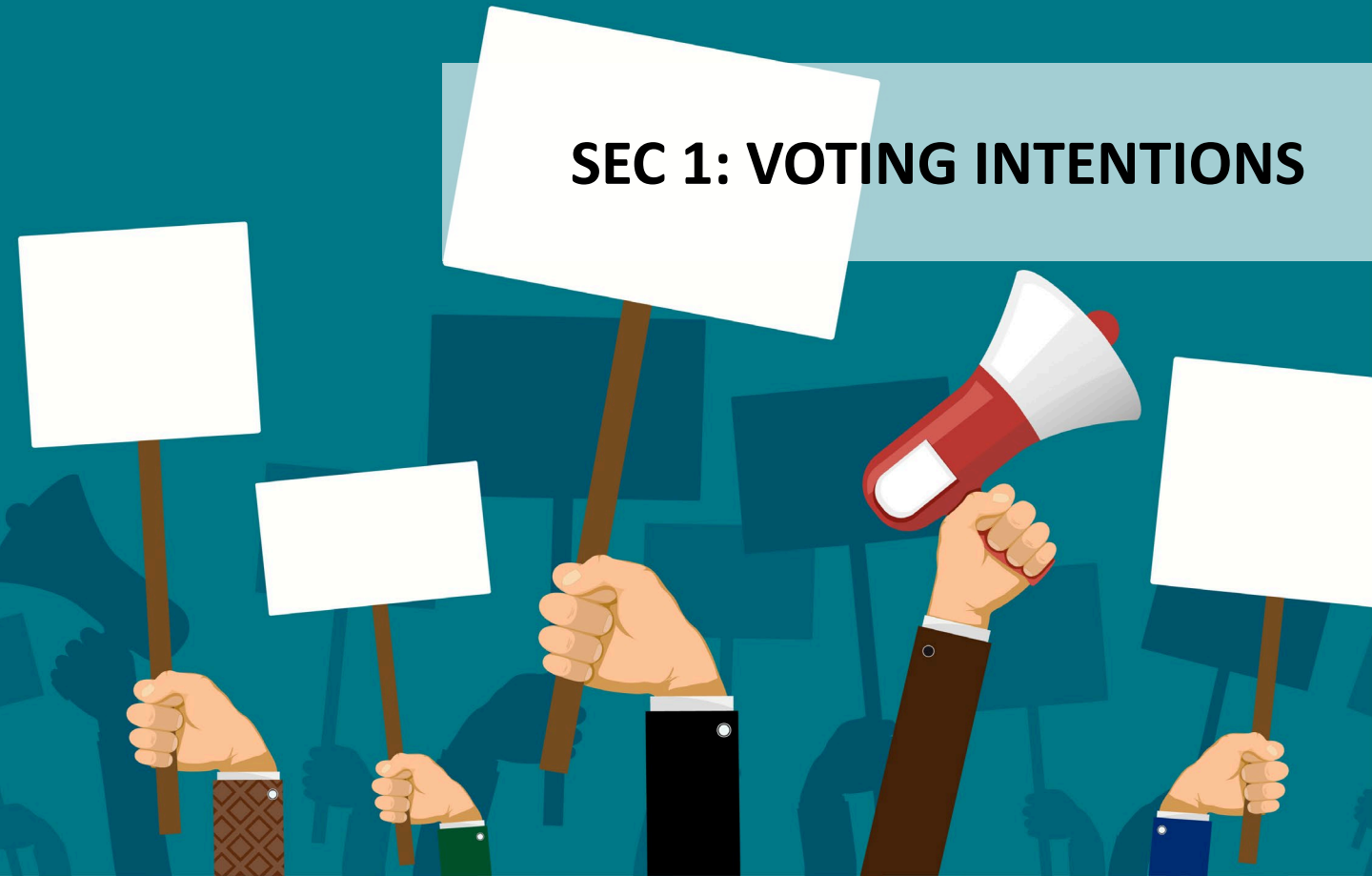

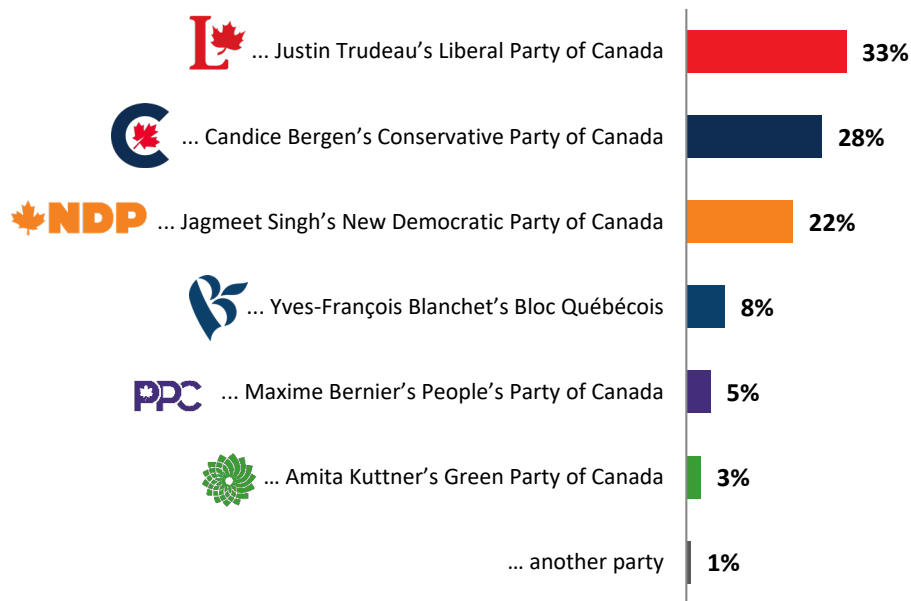

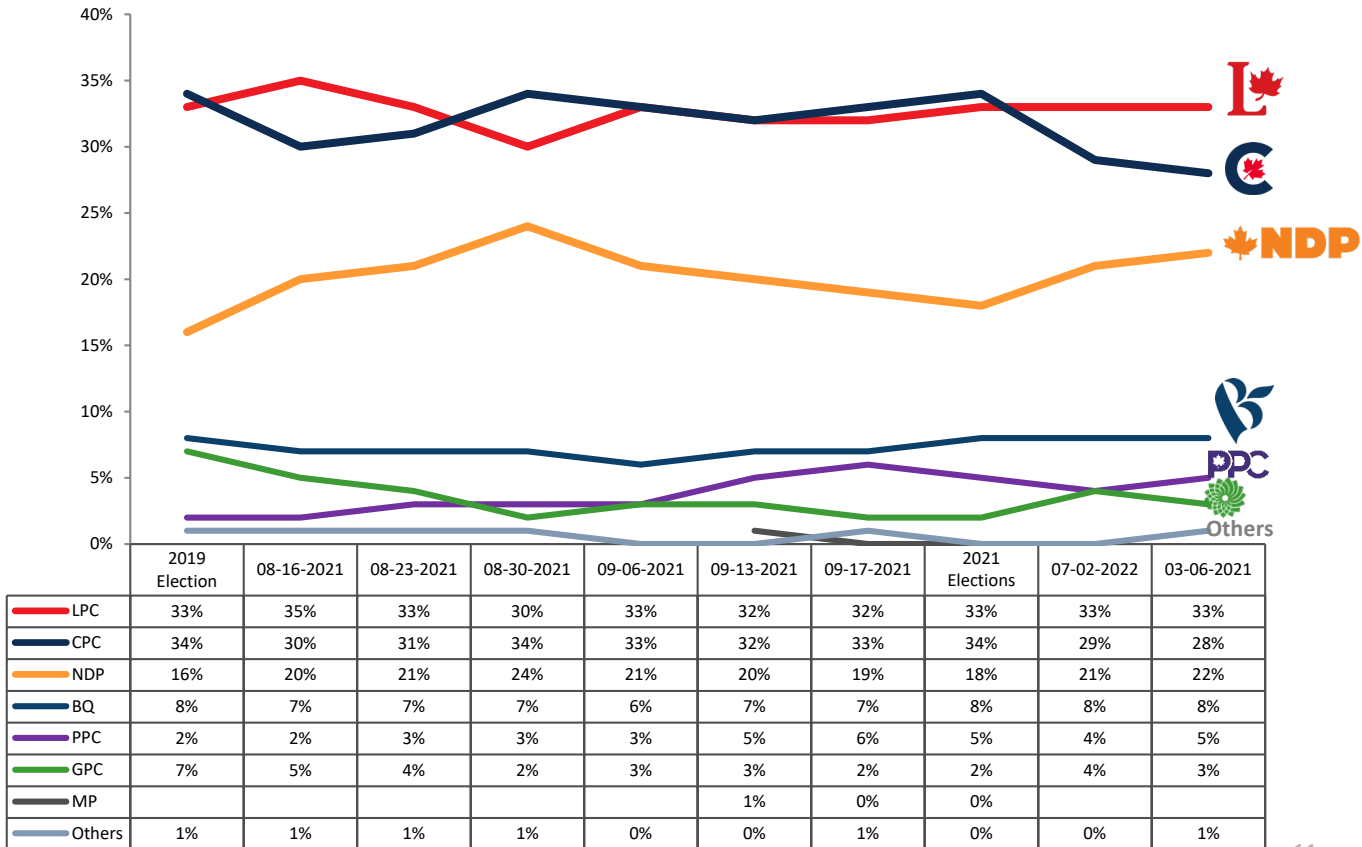

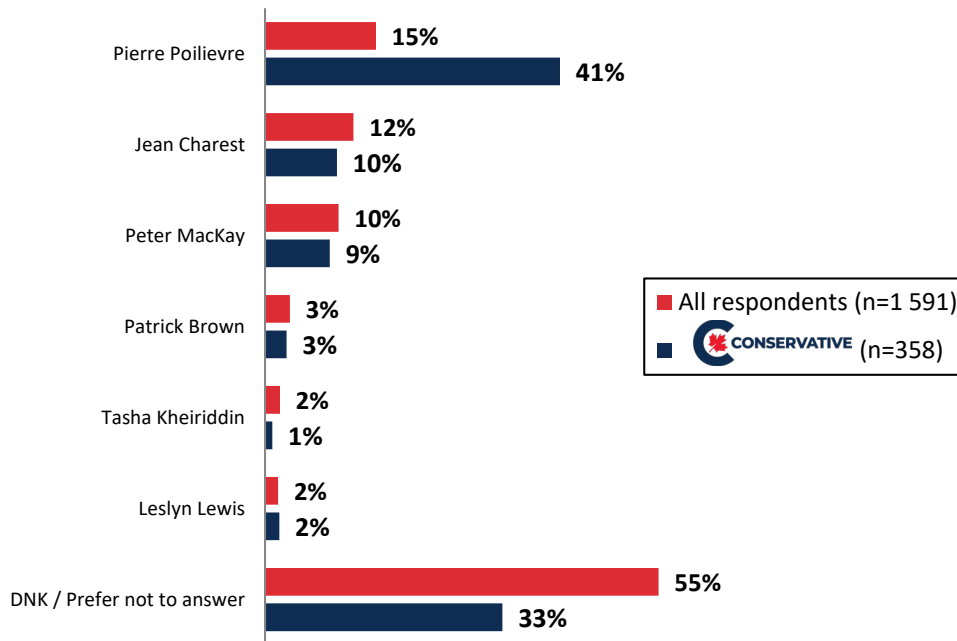
EVOLUTION OF VOTING INTENTIONS IN CANADA

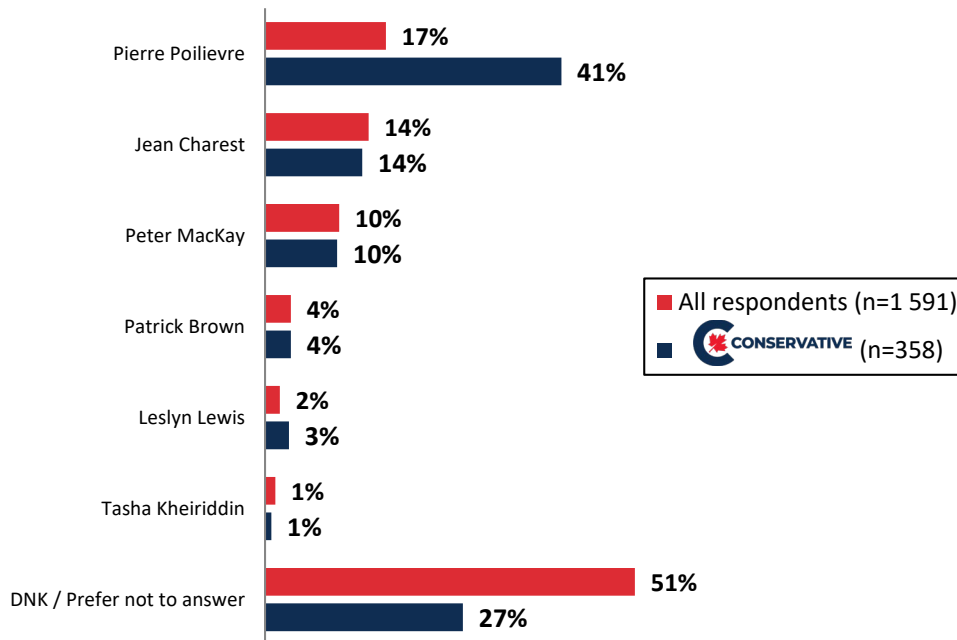

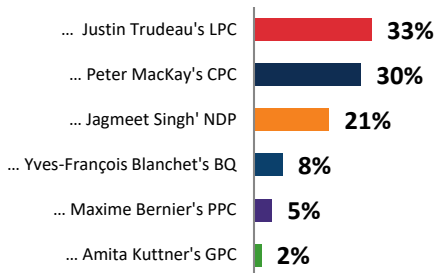

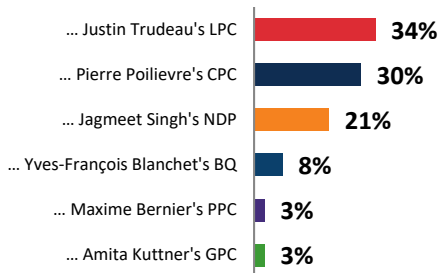

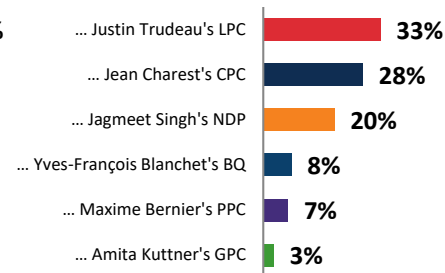

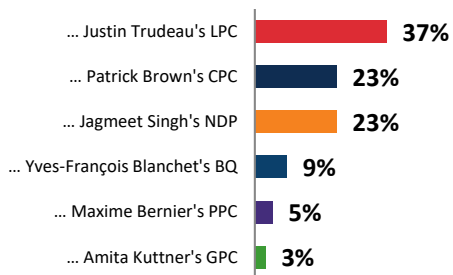

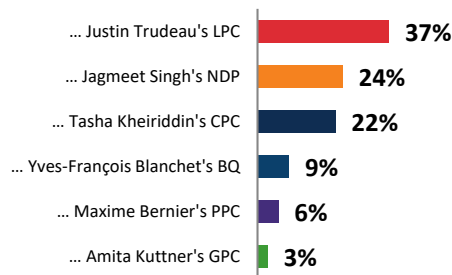

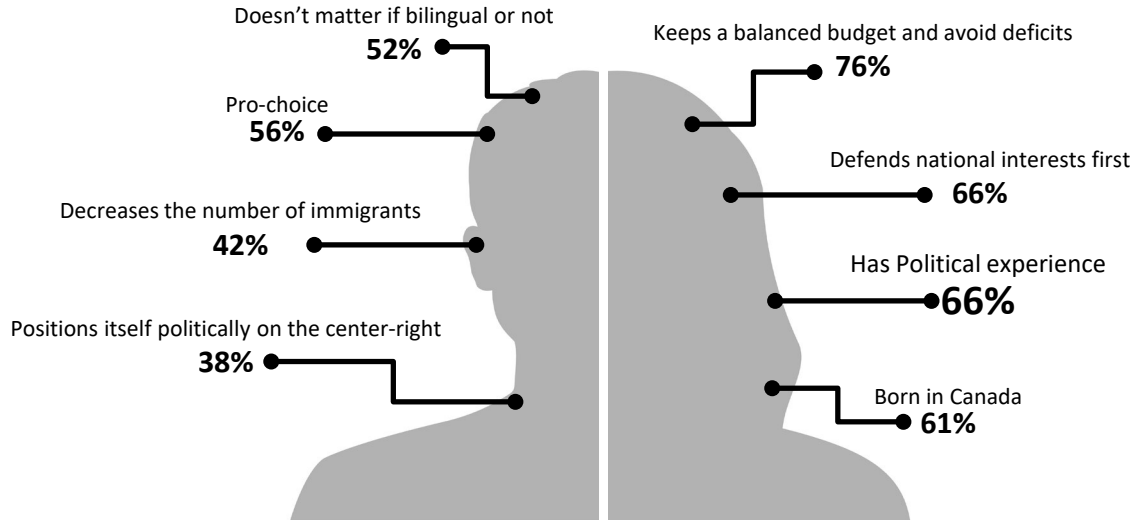

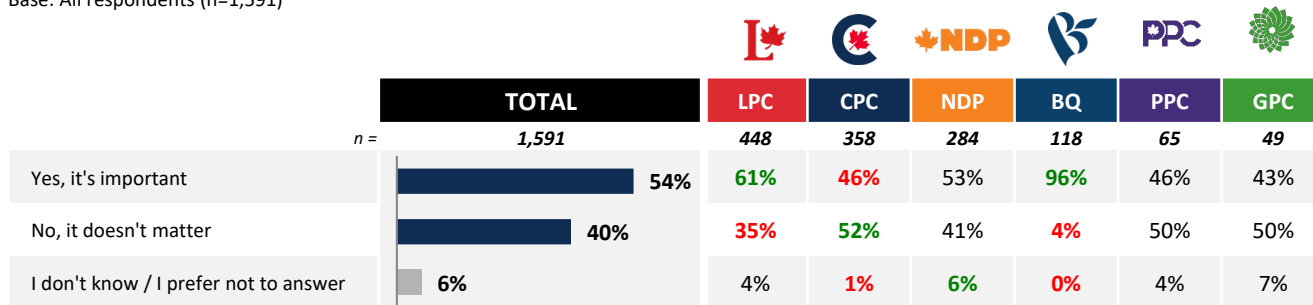

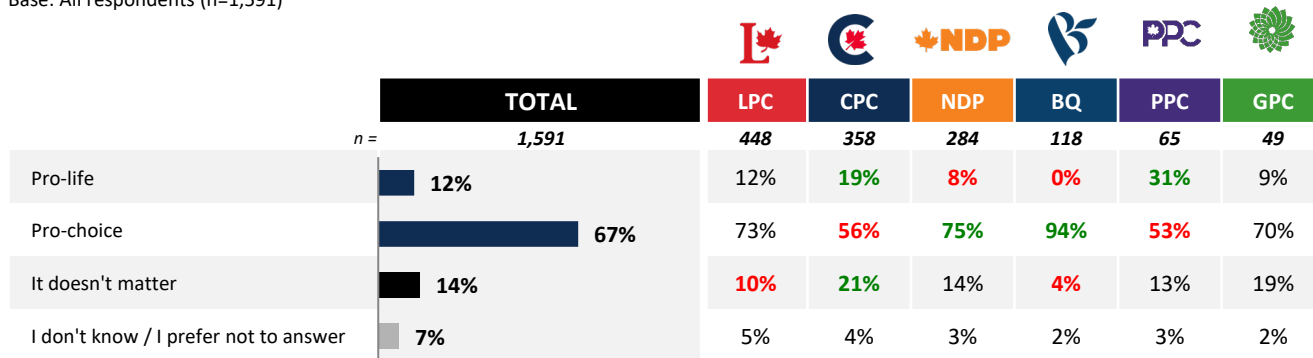

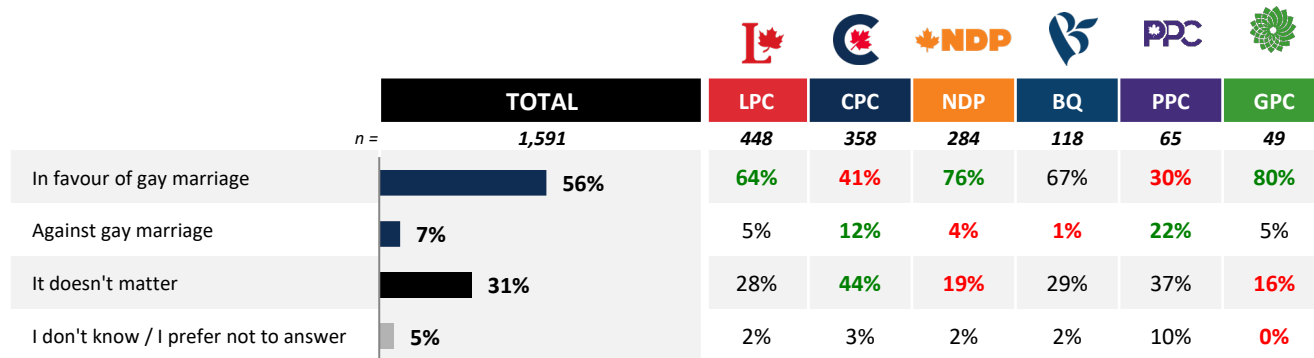

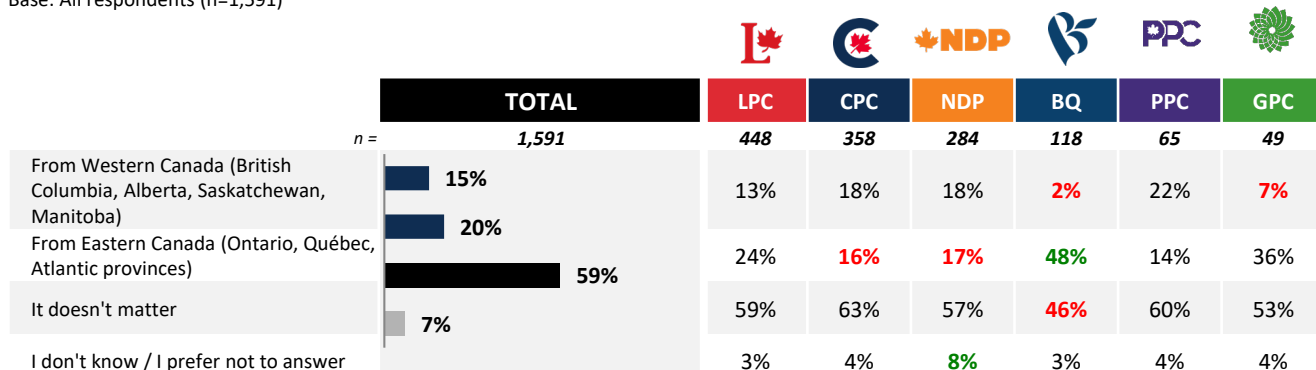

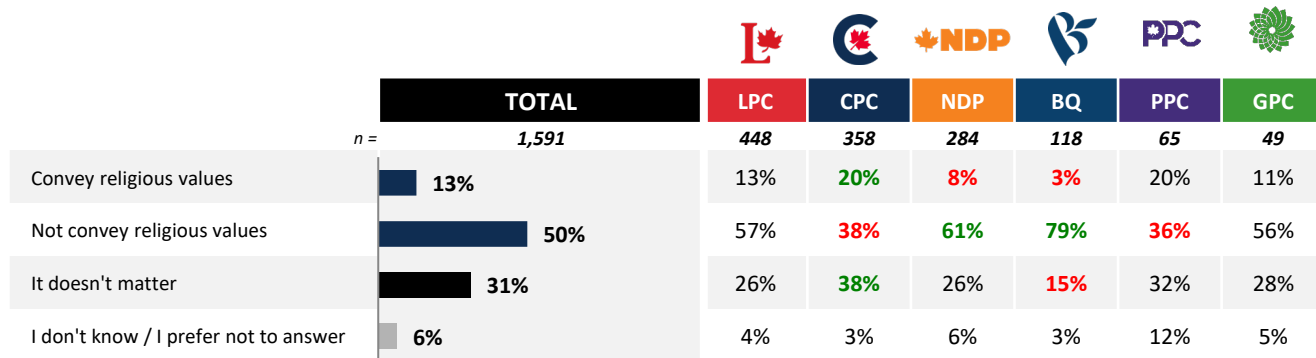

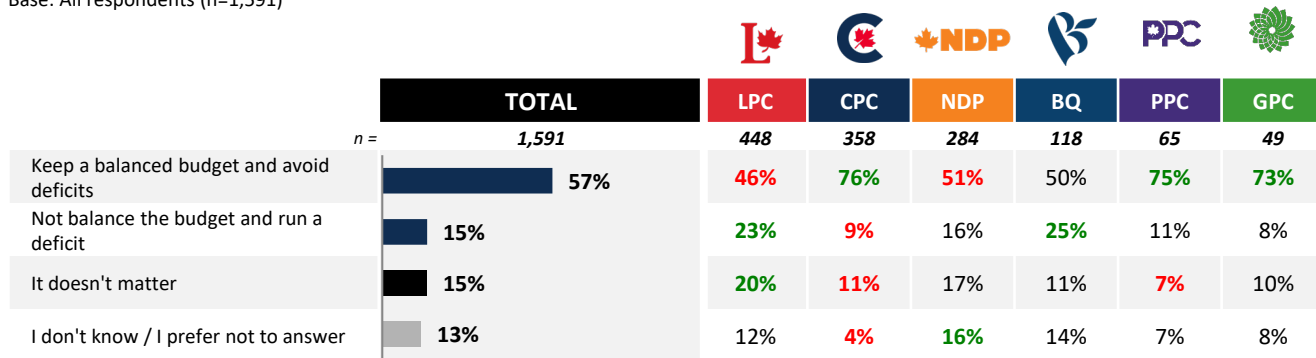

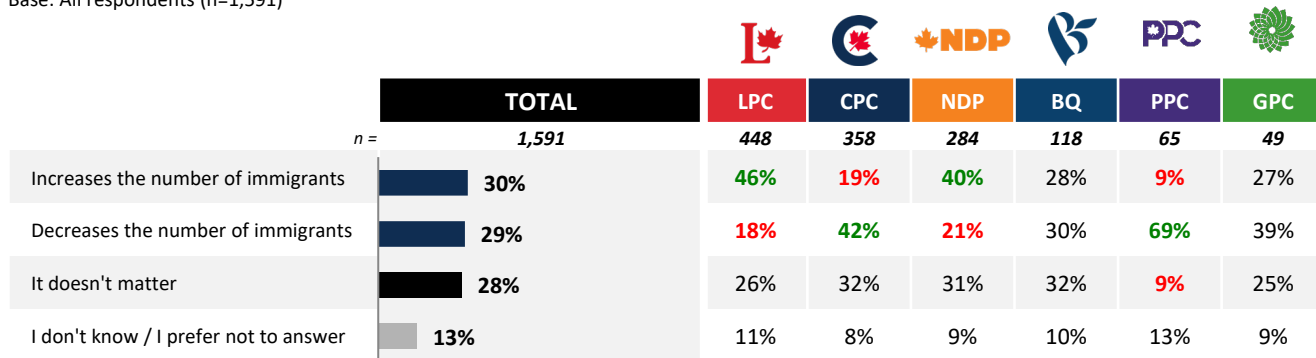

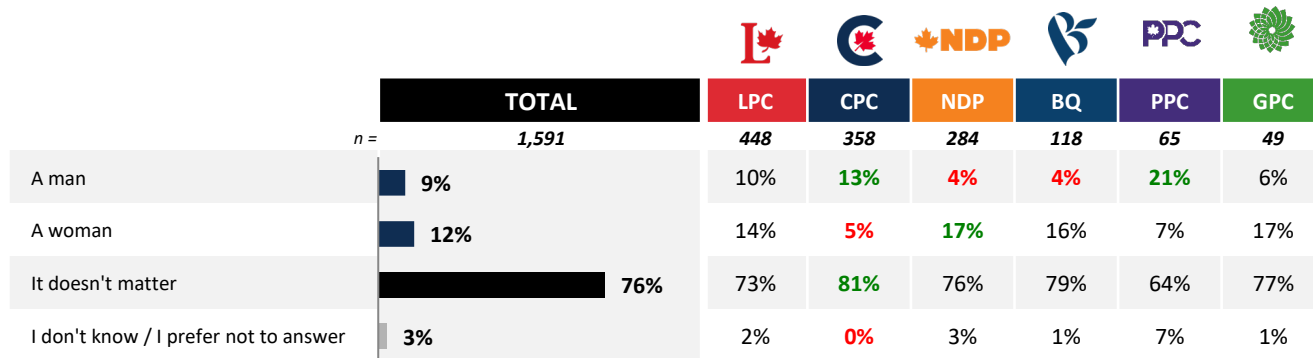

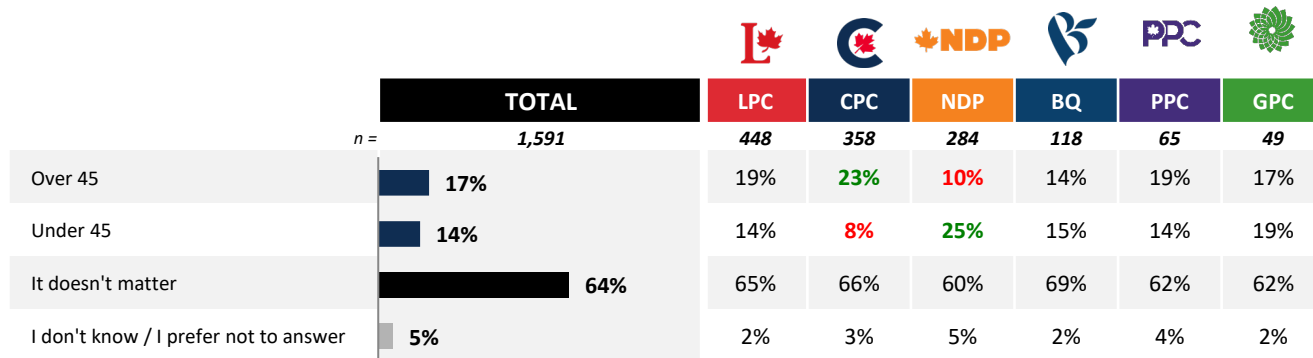

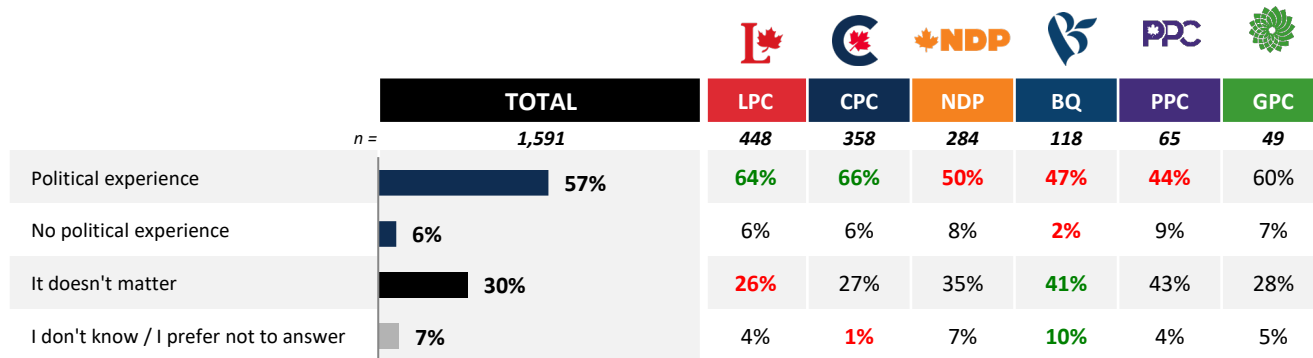

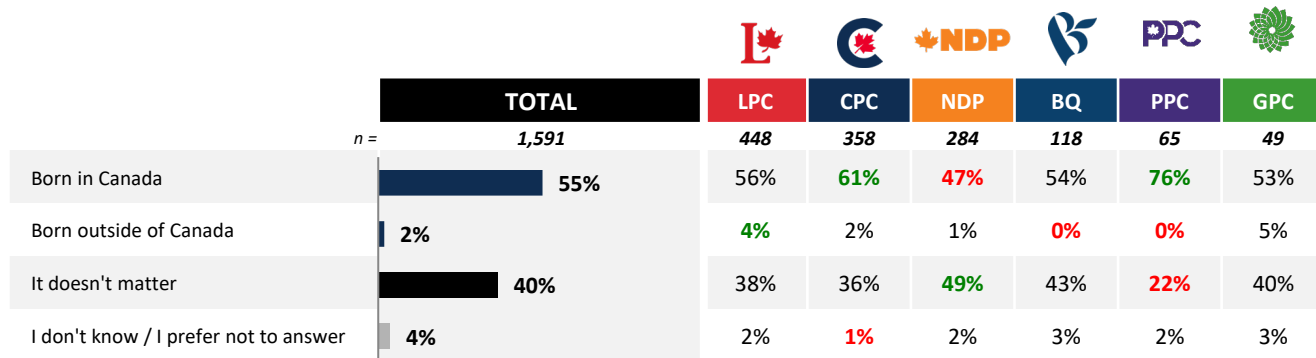

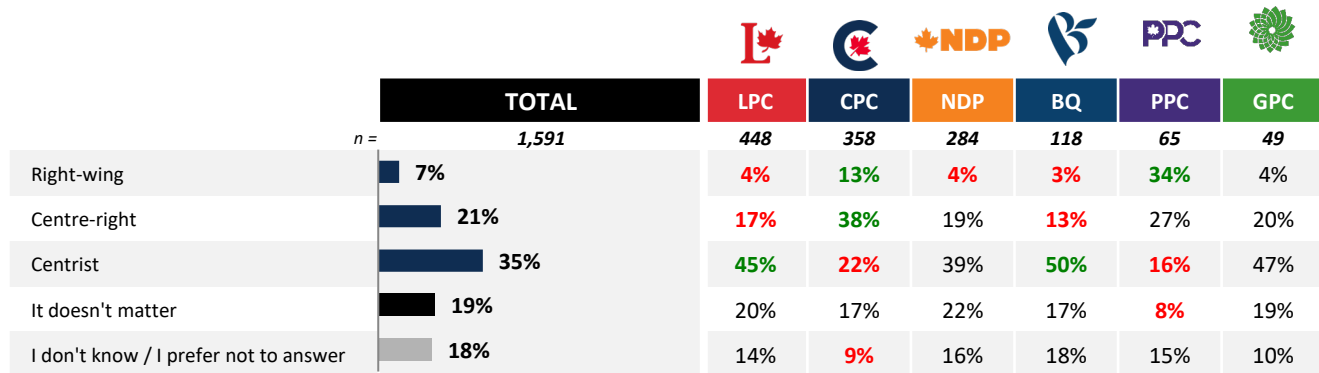

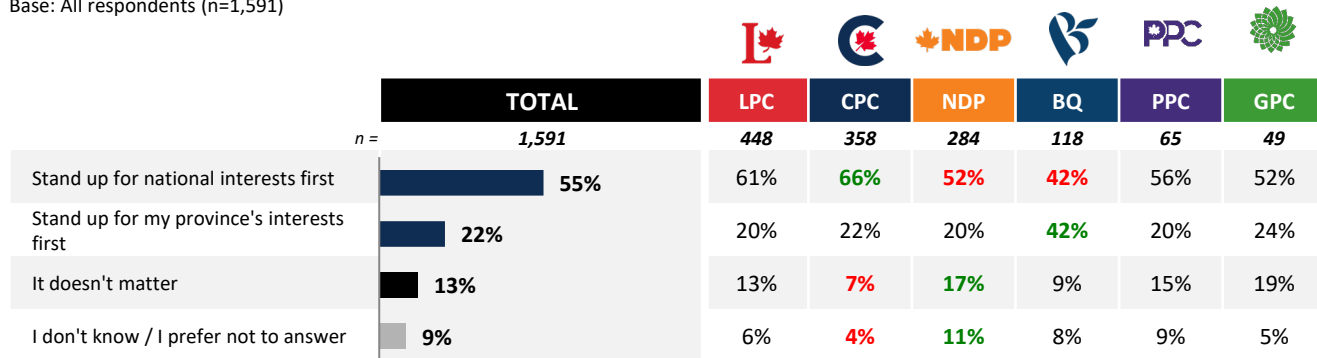

DETAILED METHODOLOGY

WEIGHTED AND UNWEIGHTED SAMPLES

The table below shows the geographic distribution of respondents, before and after weighting. There was a slight imbalance in geographic distribution in the unweighted sample. The weighting process primarily adjusted the weight of regions outside the major centers, which were slightly over-represented in the sample. These regions were oversampled to allow for a more refined analysis of the results.
