METHODOLOGY



Study Population

Albertans, ages 18 and older.



Data Collection

A total of n=1,011 surveys were conducted via Leger's LEO Panel, including:

- n=340 in Edmonton CMA
- n=335 in Calgary CMA
- n=336 in areas outside of Edmonton CMA or Calgary CMA – referred to as Other Albertans



Interviews were conducted from May 23rd to May 25th, 2023.



This web survey was conducted using computer-assisted Web interviewing (CAWI) technology.

Statistical Analysis

As a non-random internet survey, a margin of error is not reported.

If the data were collected through a random sample, the margin of error would be:

- Albertans (n=1,011) ±3.1%, 19 times out of 20.
- Edmonton CMA (n=340) ±5.3%, 19 times out of 20.
- Calgary CMA (n=335) ±5.4%, 19 times out of 20.
- Other Albertans (n=336) ±5.4%, 19 times out of 20.

Using data from the 2021 Census, results were weighted according to age, gender, region and education in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.

The numbers presented have been rounded to the nearest whole number. However, raw values were used to calculate the sums presented and therefore may not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.


In this report, data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion than that of other respondents.





Decided Voters

With less than a week to go before the next election, UCP takes a narrow lead with 49% of voting intentions among decided voters, while the NDP follows closely behind with 46%.

Among decided voters, those in Edmonton are more likely to vote NDP (56%), while those living outside of Edmonton or Calgary are more likely to vote UCP (60%). Albertans aged 55+ are more likely to vote UCP (55%) and those aged between 18 and 34 are more likely to vote NDP (56%).

Q1. If a Provincial election in Alberta was today which of the party's candidates would you be most likely to support?


Q2. Is there a Party you are leaning toward supporting, even just a little?

About three quarters of Albertans who will vote for a listed party (76%) have made a final decision for who to vote for, with 21% of Albertans indicating they may change their mind. More decided NDP voters (80%) have made a final decision as to who they will vote for.



Results are significantly different between Albertans who would vote for NDP and those who would vote for UCP.




Men and Albertans aged 55 and over are more likely to have made a final decision on who they will vote for (79% and 83%, respectively).

Nearly four-in-ten Albertans (38%) feel that Danielle Smith and the UCP will win the next provincial election and form the next government.



Those who would vote for the UCP are more likely to believe that the UCP will win the election (72%), while 62% of those who would vote for the NDP believe that the NDP will win the election.



Those living outside of the two main cities are more likely to feel that Danielle Smith and the UCP will win the next provincial election and form the next government.
