# PROVINCIAL POLITICS IN ONTARIO – *May 20-23*

#### **Poll Highlights**

With a little over a week left in the election campaign, Doug Ford has extended his lead over Steven Del Duca and the Liberals. Ford and the PC's lead by 12 points. The NDP have increased their support among decided voters which combined with a small decline in support for the Liberals is tightening up the contest for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> showing.

Demographically, the PCs are polling strong among voters age 55 and older and regionally in the 905 and Southwestern Ontario. Metro Toronto, Hamilton/Niagara and Eastern Ontario could see some close riding races on election night with all three parties competitive.

This poll we looked at how the leaders our connecting with voters on a series of personality attributes.

- **Doug Ford**'s strongest associations were with: *Out of touch; Uncaring; Getting things done; Divisive*; and, *Ready to govern*
- **Steven Del Duca**'s strongest associations were with: *Not ready to govern; Boring; Out of touch; Weak*; and, *Risky*
- Andrea Horwath's strongest associations were with: Not ready to govern; Ready to govern; Out of touch; Stable; and, Someone I can relate to

On the all-important question in elections, *Who would make the best Premier*, Ford continues to come out ahead at 31% followed by Horwath (22%), Del Duca at 12% and Schreiner at 9%





#### Methodology



Web survey using computer-assisted Web interviewing (CAWI) technology.



From May 20 to 23, 2022



1503 Ontario residents, 18 years of age or older, who are eligible to vote in Ontario, randomly recruited from LEO's online panel.



Using data from the 2021 Census, results were weighted according to age and gender within Ontario regions, as well as by education and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.



For comparison purposes, a probability sample of 1503 respondents would have a margin of error of  $\pm$  2.5%, 19 times out of 20.

The research results presented here are in full compliance with the CRIC Public Opinion Research Standards and Disclosure Requirements.




#### Methodology








# SECOND CHOICE BY CURRENT VOTING INTENTION








# IMPRESSION OF PARTY LEADERS SINCE THE CAMPAIGN BEGAN

Q6. In the past week, has your opinion of the following leaders improved, stayed the same or worsened?





#### **Detailed Methodology**

#### **Sampling Frame**

Participants were randomly selected from LEO's online panel.

Leger owns and manages an Internet panel that includes more than 400,000 Canadians coast to coast. An online panel consists of Web users profiled according to different demographic variables. The majority of Leger's panel members (60%) were randomly recruited over the phone in the past ten years, which makes this panel very similar to the current Canadian population on a number of demographic characteristics. Moreover, 35% of panellists were recruited through affiliate programs and 5% through partner campaigns and programs.

To be eligible, respondents were required to be 18 years of age or older and have the right to vote in Ontario.
