

Methodology



Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.

(U.S. sample: n= 1,003).

Respondents were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.



When

May 24 to May 26, 2024



Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than ±3.09% (19 times out of 20).



Weighting

Results were weighted according to age, gender, region, education, ethnicity, and number of people in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the American population.



Methodology



Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion that that of other respondents.



Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

Key Highlights

Every month, we conduct a survey of U.S. residents to explore their views on the economy, finances, and the government. This month, our survey was conducted between May 24 and 26, 2024.

Some of the key highlights on the U.S. economy include...

- More than half (57%) of residents think the United States is currently in a recession. This represents a threepoint increase since last month (54%).
- Four out of ten (42%) describe their household's finances as poor (30%) or very poor (12%).
- More than half (57%) say they are living paycheck to paycheck, an increase of 3 points compared to April 2024 (54%).
- Among those currently employed, nearly half (47%) are concerned about losing their job in the next 12 months, an increase of 3 points compared to April 2024 (44%).

Some of the key highlights on U.S. politics include ...

- If the Presidential election were to be held today, Trump would secure 46% of the votes, while Biden would secure 45%, making them statistically head-to-head.
- A larger proportion of U.S. residents (41%) think that Trump will win the 2024 presidential election, while a third (33%) think Joe Biden will win.
- More than half of U.S. residents (55%) think that things were better under Trump's presidency, while 45% think that things are better under Joe Biden's presidency.
- Six out of ten (58%) Democratic voters would have preferred the Democratic Party to choose a
 candidate other than Joe Biden. This proportion is higher (72%) among Democratic voters aged 18 to
 34 years old.





Key Highlights (2/2)

- One-third of Republican voters (33%) would have preferred the Republican Party to choose a candidate other than Donald Trump. This proportion is higher (47%) among Republican voters aged 18 to 34 years old.
- Eight out of ten (81%) Republican voters mentioned that their vote is more for Donald Trump, while 19% suggested it's more a vote against Joe Biden. On the other hand, 69% of the Democratic voters mentioned their vote was more of a vote for Biden, and 31% mentioned it was more of a vote against Donald Trump. Democratic voters aged 55 or older (38%) are more likely to say their vote is a vote against Donald Trump, rather than for Joe Biden.






State of Household Finances (1/3)












Economic Recession in the Country (1/2)








Concerns About Losing Job (1/3)




Concerns About Losing Job – *Trended*






US Voting Intentions (1/2)














Q1A. Is your choice more a vote for Donald Trump or more a vote against Joe Biden?



Preference for Alternative Presidential Candidates (1/2)


Q2A. Would you have preferred the Republican Party to choose a candidate other than Donald Trump?


