Methodology



Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.
(U.S. sample: n= 1,003).
Respondents were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.

Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than $\pm 3.09\%$ (19 times out of 20).



Weighting

Results were weighted according to **age, gender, region, education, ethnicity, and number of people in the household** in order to ensure a representative sample of the American population.

Methodology



Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion that that of other respondents.



Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

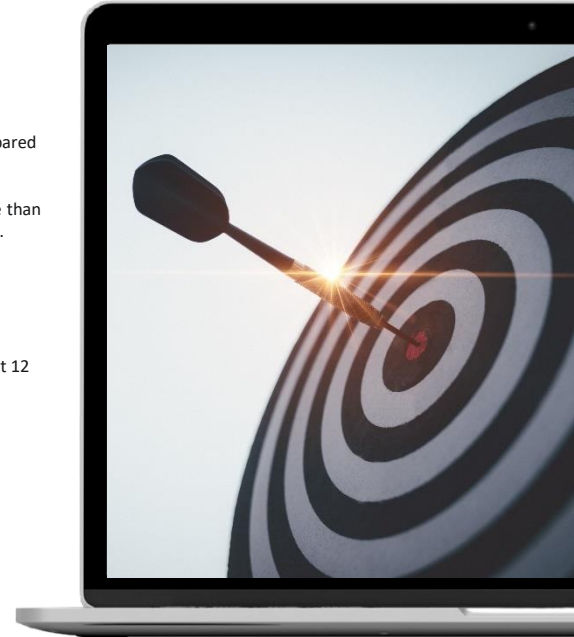

Key Highlights

Every month, we conduct a survey of U.S. residents to explore their views on the economy, finances, and the government. This month, our survey was conducted between June 22 and 24, 2024.

Some of the key highlights on the U.S. economy include...

- More than half (57%) of residents think the United States is currently in a recession. This is stable compared to last month.
- Four out of ten (39%) describe their household's finances as poor (26%) or very poor (13%), while more than half (57%) describe their household's finances as very good (12%) or good (45%). The proportion of U.S. residents describing their household's finances as good/very good experienced an increase of 3 points compared to May 2024.
- More than half (56%) say they are living paycheck to paycheck. This is stable compared to last month.
- Among those currently employed, four out of ten (40%) are concerned about losing their job in the next 12 months, a decrease of 7 points compared to May 2024.

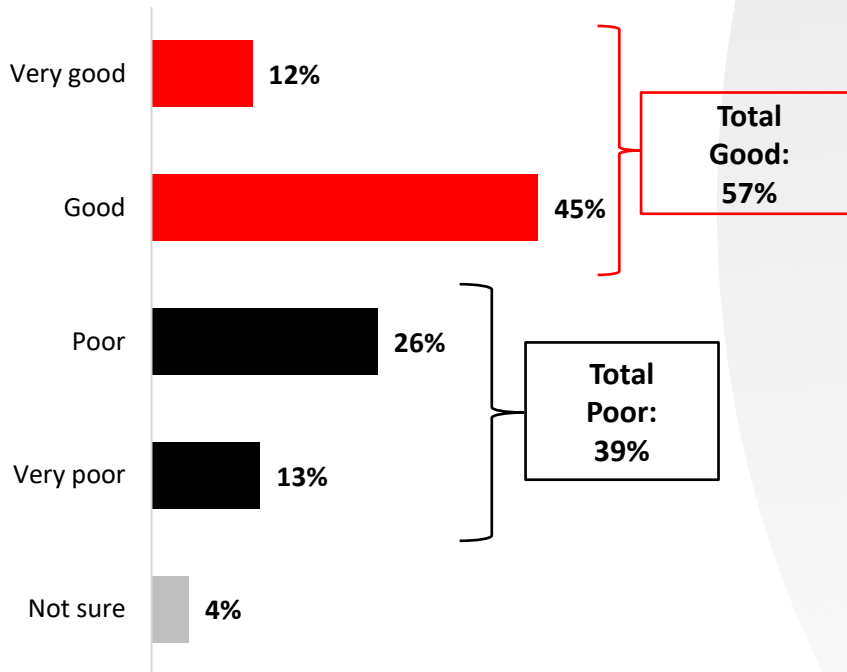

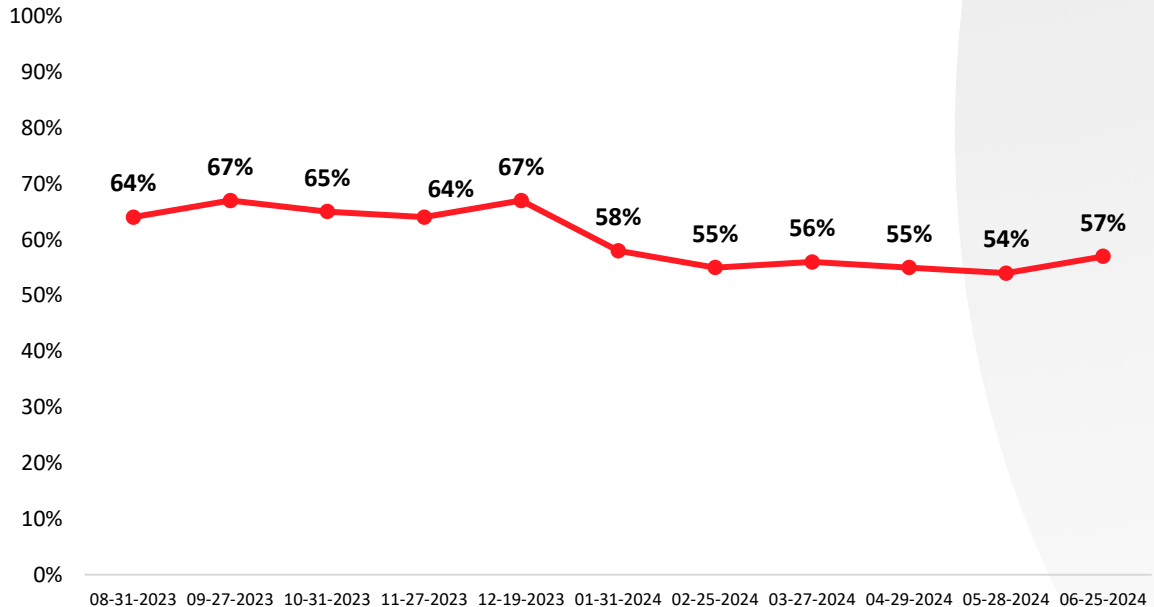

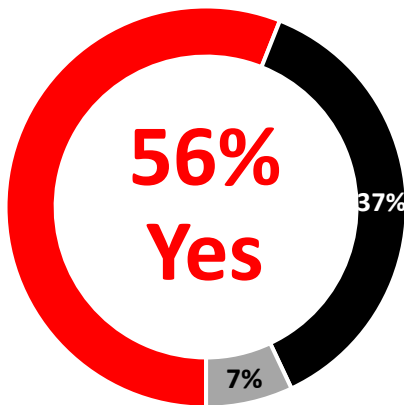

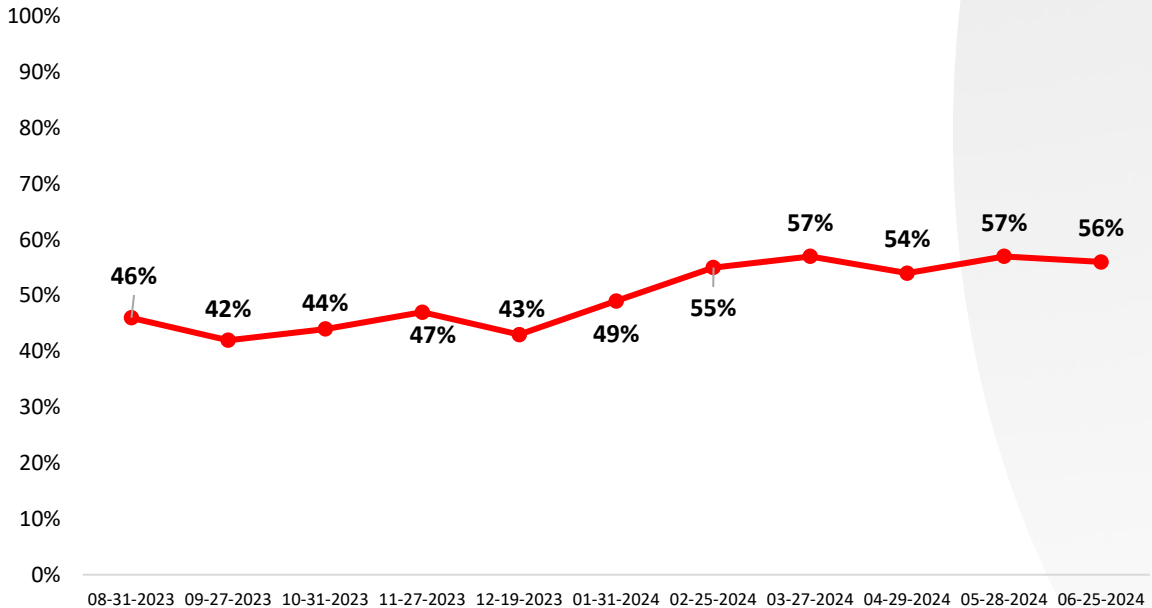

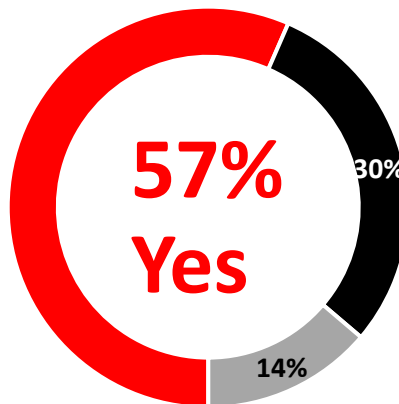

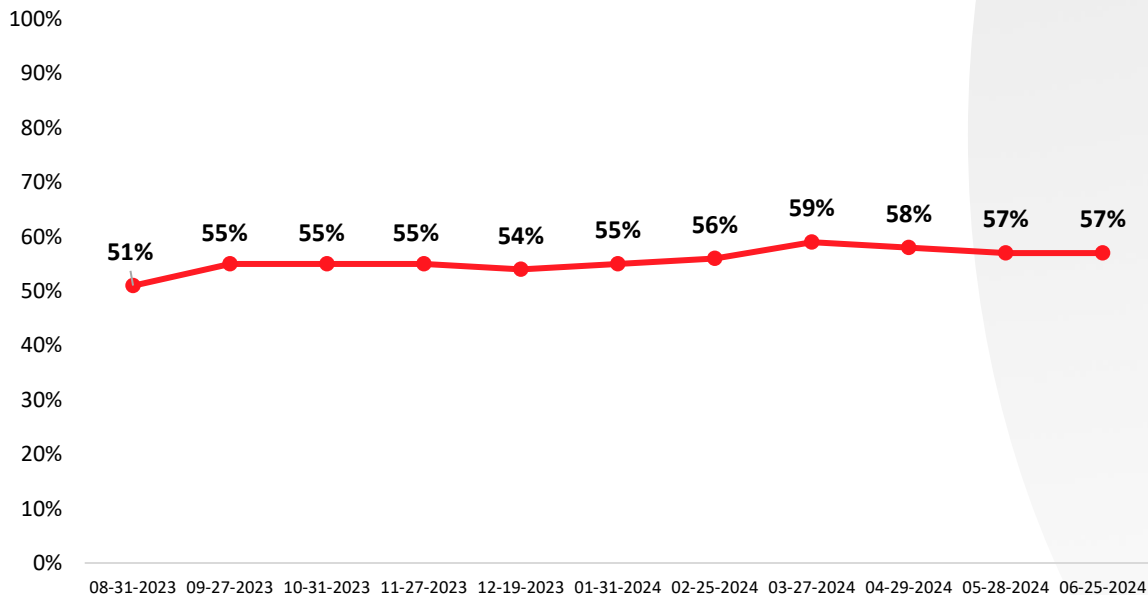

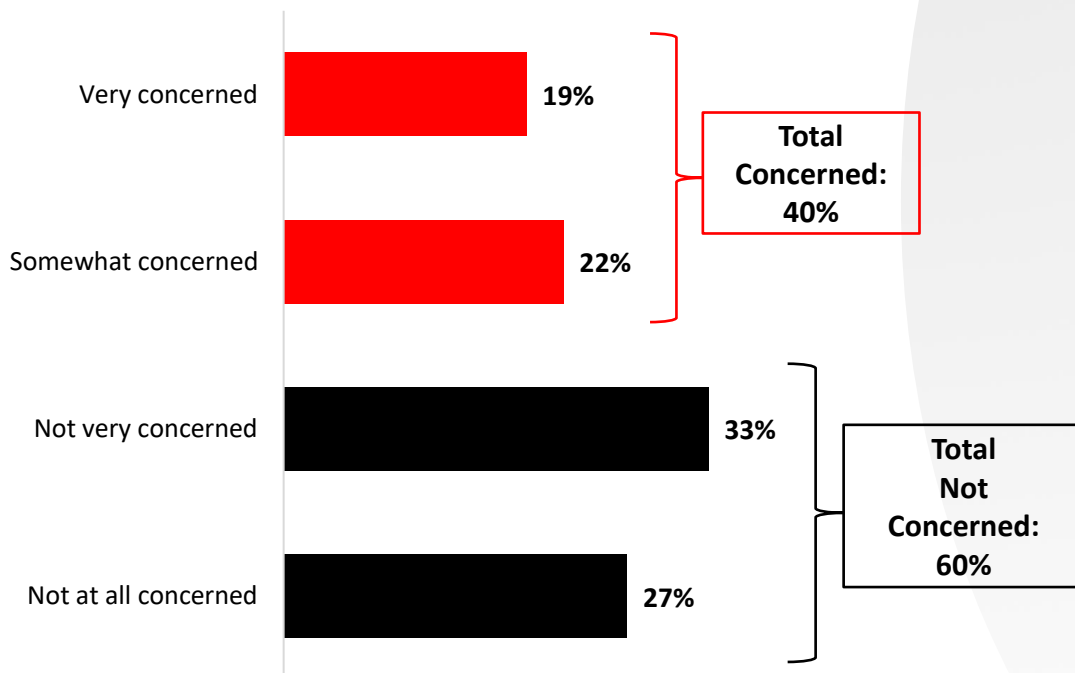

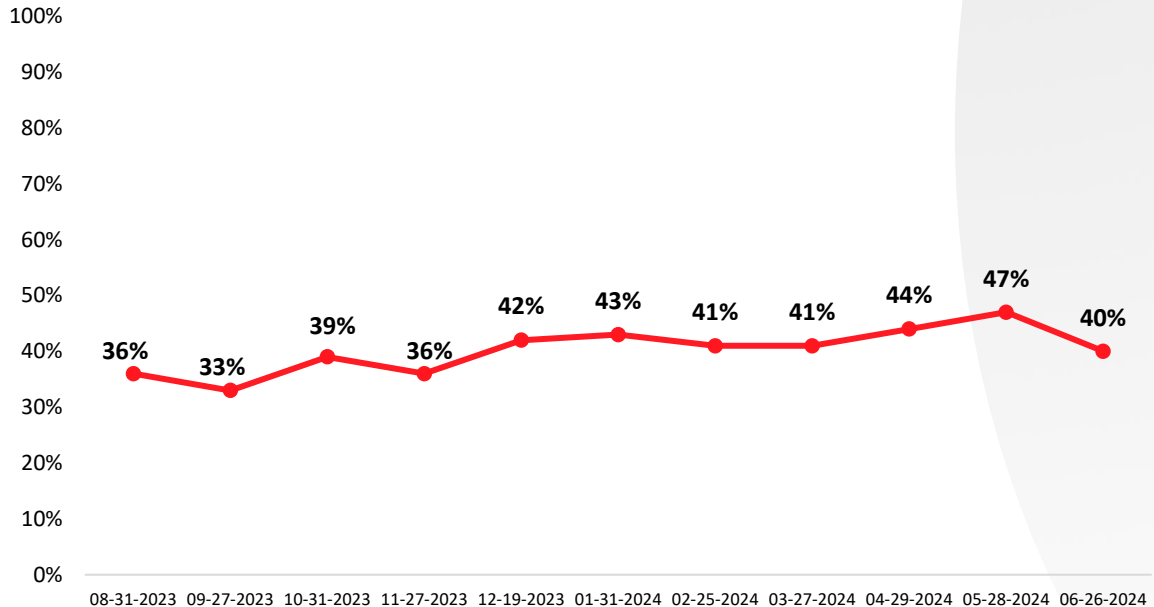
