Methodology

Every month, we conduct a survey of Canadians to explore their views on the current government and politics in Canada.

Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older. (Canadian sample: **n= 1,549**).

Respondents had the option of completing the survey in English or in French and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.

Weighting

Results were weighted according to age, gender, mother tongue, region, education and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the Canadian population.

A more detailed methodology is presented in the Appendix.

When

Data collection from **November 1**st to **November 3**rd, **2024**.

Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than **±2.49**%, (19 times out of 20) for the Canadian sample.

Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion than that of other respondents.

Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up.

However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

Most accurate polling firm

Leger is the polling firm that has presented the most accurate election survey data, on average, over the last ten years in Canada. During the last federal election in 2021, Leger was once again **the most accurate firm in the country**. This accuracy is attributed to the quality of the LEO panel and rigorous application of methodological rules by Leger's 600 employees, including 200 professionals in Leger's eight offices across Canada (Montreal, Toronto, Quebec City, Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver) and in the United States (New York).

Poll aggregator 338Canada.com gave Leger the highest rating among all polling firms in Canada for the accuracy of its studies.

Key highlights: Canadian Politics

Every month, we conduct a survey of Canadians to explore their views on the current government and politics in Canada. This month, our survey was conducted between **November 1**st and 3rd, 2024.

Some of the key highlights of our survey about Canadian federal politics include...

1

Pierre Poilievre's Conservative Party is currently leading by 16 points, ahead of Justin Trudeau's Liberal Party. If a federal election were held today, 42% of Canadians would vote for the Conservative Party of Canada, while 26% would vote for Justin Trudeau's Liberal Party. The NDP trail at 15%, equally their low-water mark set back in August of this year.

The CPC have comfortable leads over the Liberals of 20+ points in key battleground provinces of Ontario and BC, as well as across all demographic sub-groups.



There continues to be significant dissatisfaction with Justin Trudeau's government among Canadians. Almost seven out of ten Canadians (68%) are dissatisfied, while only 27% say they are currently satisfied. Only 5% of respondents reported being "very satisfied" with the current government, compared to 43% who are "very dissatisfied".

Pierre Poilievre is still perceived as the best candidate for Prime Minister, now at 30% this month. Meanwhile, only 17% see Justin Trudeau as the best PM, a modest 2-point increase from last month (15%).

Government Satisfaction






Voting Intentions - Federal Elections (1/2)

Voting Intentions - Federal Elections (2/2)



Evolution of Voting Intentions in Canada






Satisfaction With Trudeau's Government (1/2)








Leader Who Would Make the Best Prime Minister (1/2)


