Survey of Canadians



November 3, 2025



Methodology

This week, we surveyed Canadians on politics, government performance, and key national issues.

Method

Online survey among respondents 18 years of age or older.
(Canadian sample: **n= 1,585**)

Respondents had the option of completing the survey in French and English and were randomly recruited using LEO's online panel.

Weighting

Results were weighted according to **age, gender, mother tongue, region, education and presence of children in the household** in order to ensure a representative sample of the Canadian population.

When

Data collection from **October 31 to November 2, 2025**.

Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size yields a margin of error no greater than **±2.5%**, (19 times out of 20) for the sample.

Significant differences

Data in bold **red** characters indicate a significantly lower proportion than that of other respondents. Conversely, data in bold **green** characters indicate a significantly higher proportion than that of other respondents.

Rounded data

The numbers presented have been rounded up. However, the numbers before rounding were used to calculate the sums presented and might therefore not correspond to the manual addition of these numbers.

Key Highlights

Some of **the key highlights** of our survey...

- If an election were held today, the Liberal Party of Canada would receive 43% of the vote among decided voters, maintaining its lead over the Conservative Party at 38%. The Bloc Québécois sits at 7%, followed by the NDP at 7%, and the Green Party at 4%. Voting intentions remain stable compared to last month.
- Satisfaction and approval ratings for Mark Carney's government have risen significantly this month. The satisfaction rate stands at 50% (up 4 points in one month), and the approval rate is at 52% (up 5 points).
- One in five Canadians (20%) would like the next federal election to be held now or as soon as possible, compared to 18% who would prefer it to take place next year. However, half of Canadians (50%) would like it to be held as scheduled, in about four years. Conservative voters (47%) are more likely to want an election now.
- Most Canadians are disappointed with the progress on some of the commitments Mark Carney made during his campaign, giving average ratings out of ten ranging from 5.6 to 4.5. Addressing the cost-of-living crisis in Canada received the lowest score (4.5/10), while restoring the strength and capacity of Canada's military forces received the highest (5.6/10).
- Half of Canadians (47%) would say the feeling of unity in Canada has improved under Mark Carney, while 27% say it remained the same and 15% think it has worsened. Conservative voters (34%) are more likely to think the unity has worsened.
- A majority of Canadians (39%) say they feel an equal feeling of optimism and pessimism about their personal, social, financial, and professional situation. While 34% describe themselves as mostly optimistic and happy, this sentiment weakens as the focus widens, falling to 29% for their city or community, 21% for their province, 26% for Canada, and only 16% for the world, where pessimism (51%) clearly outweighs optimism.

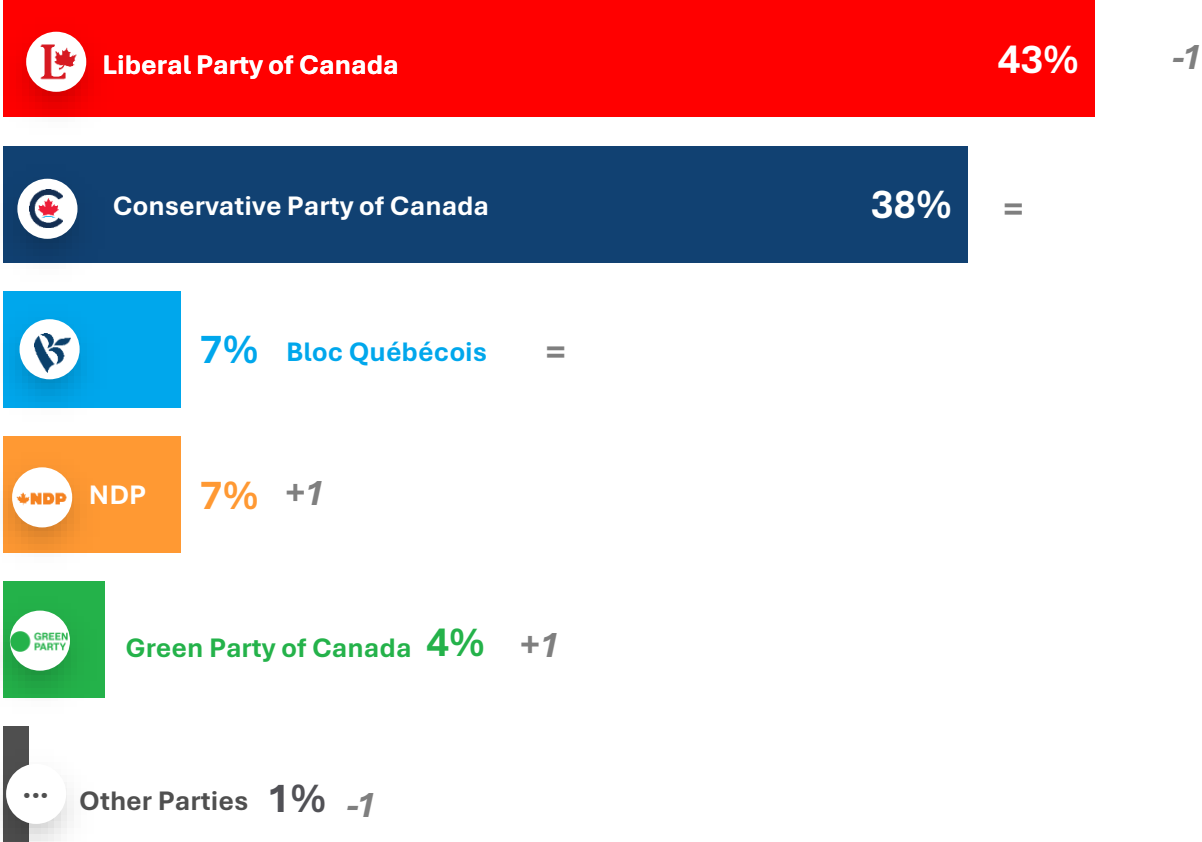
Federal Voting Intentions

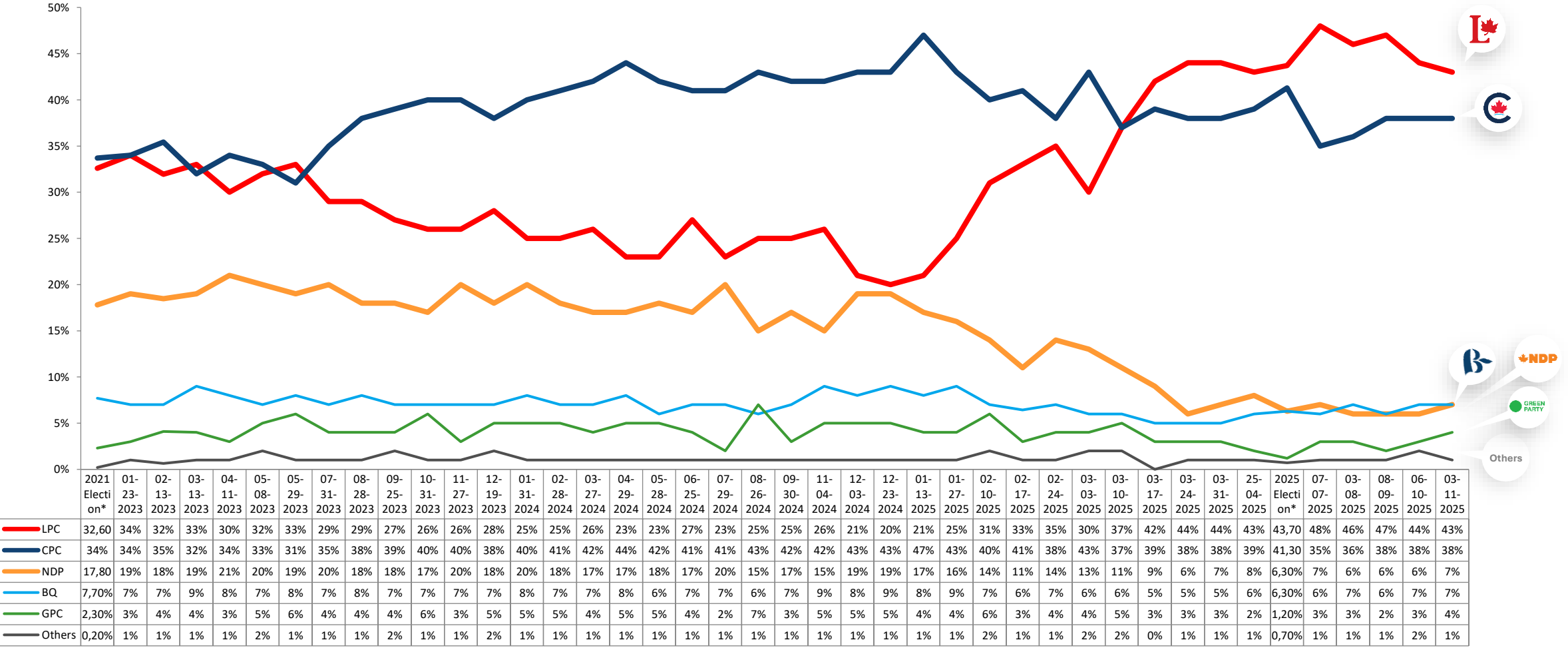

Evolution of Voting Intentions in Canada



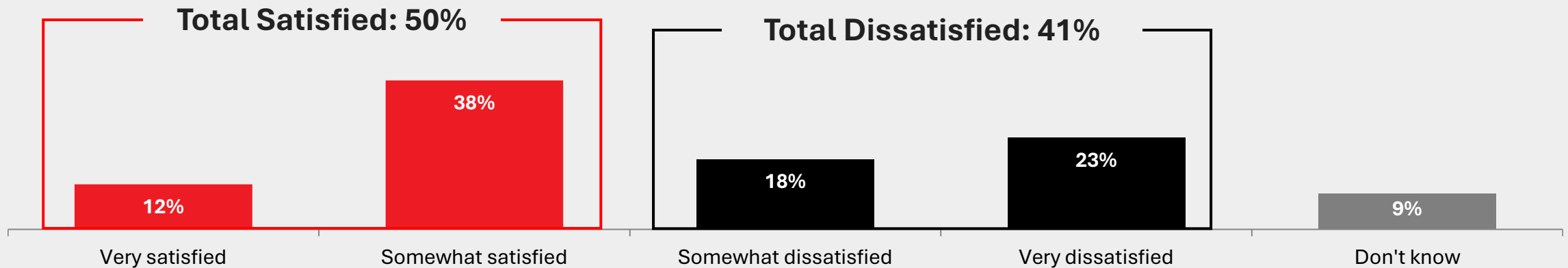

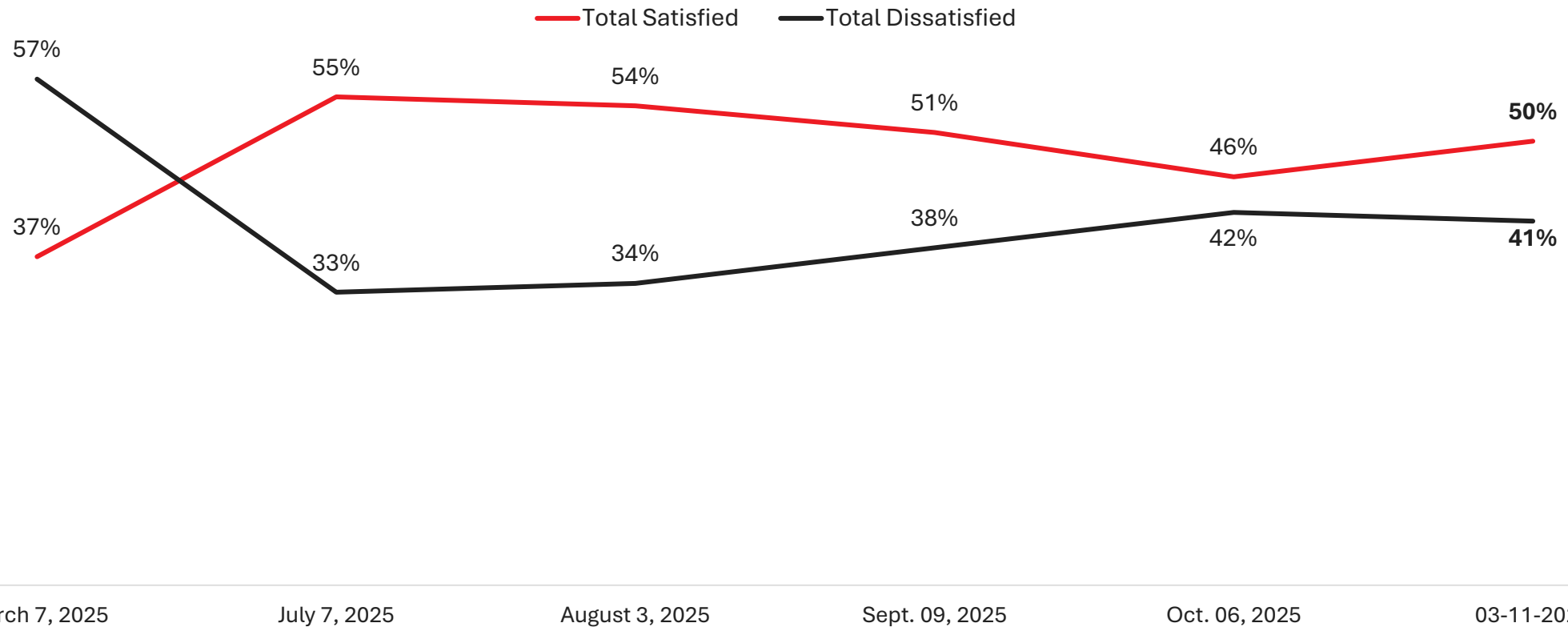

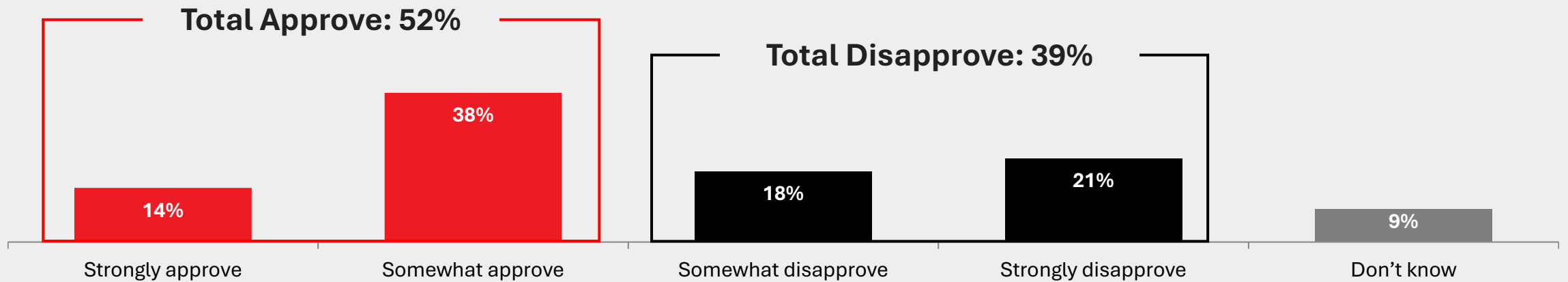

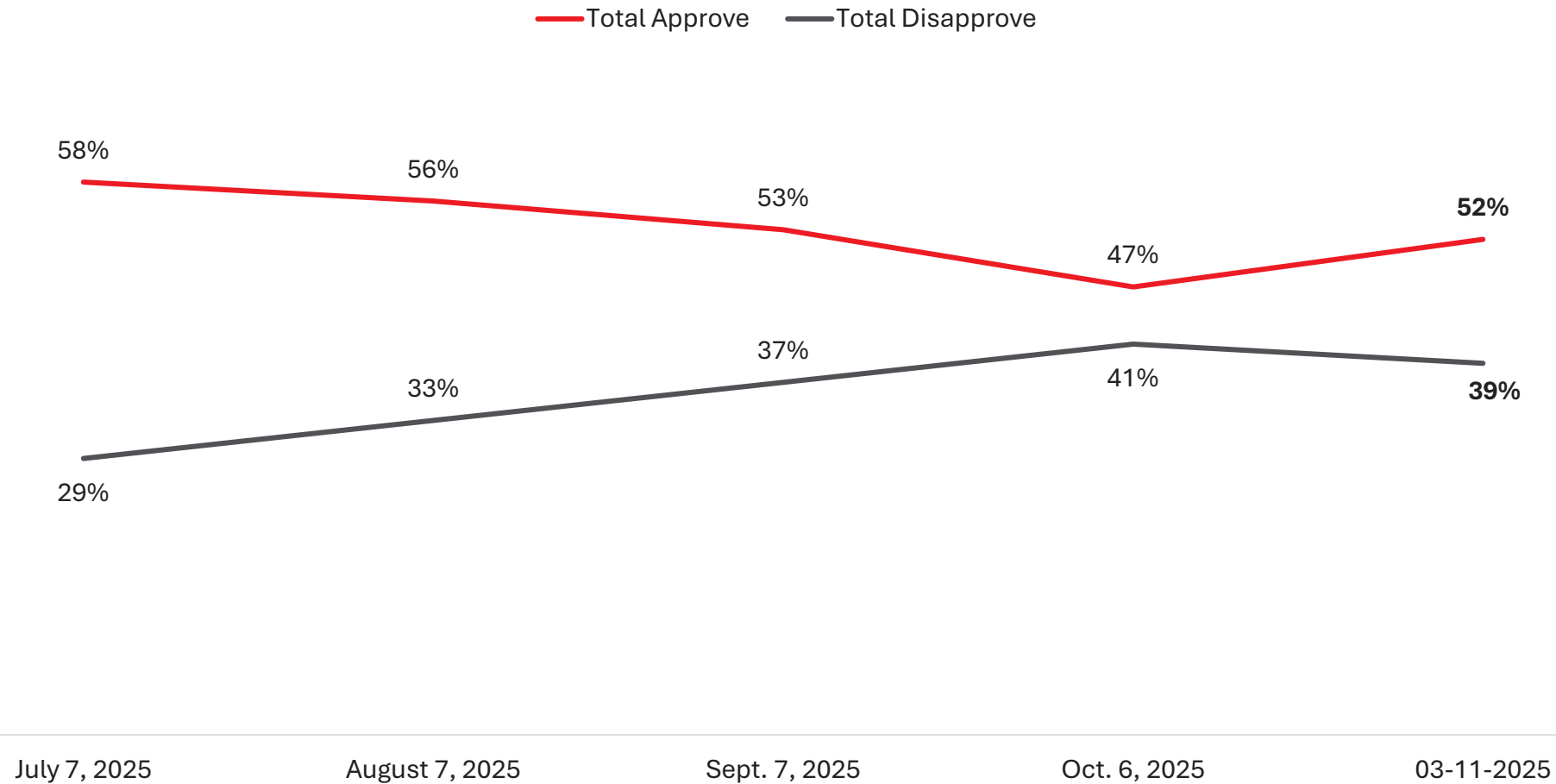

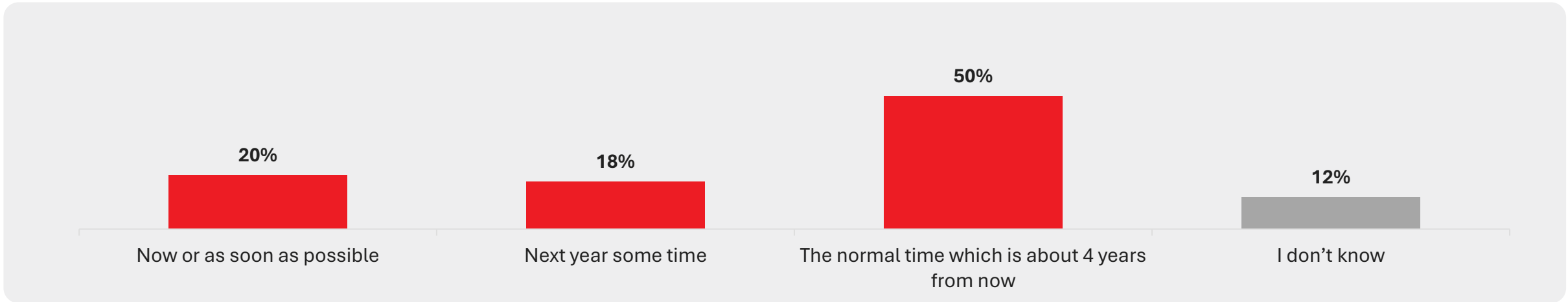

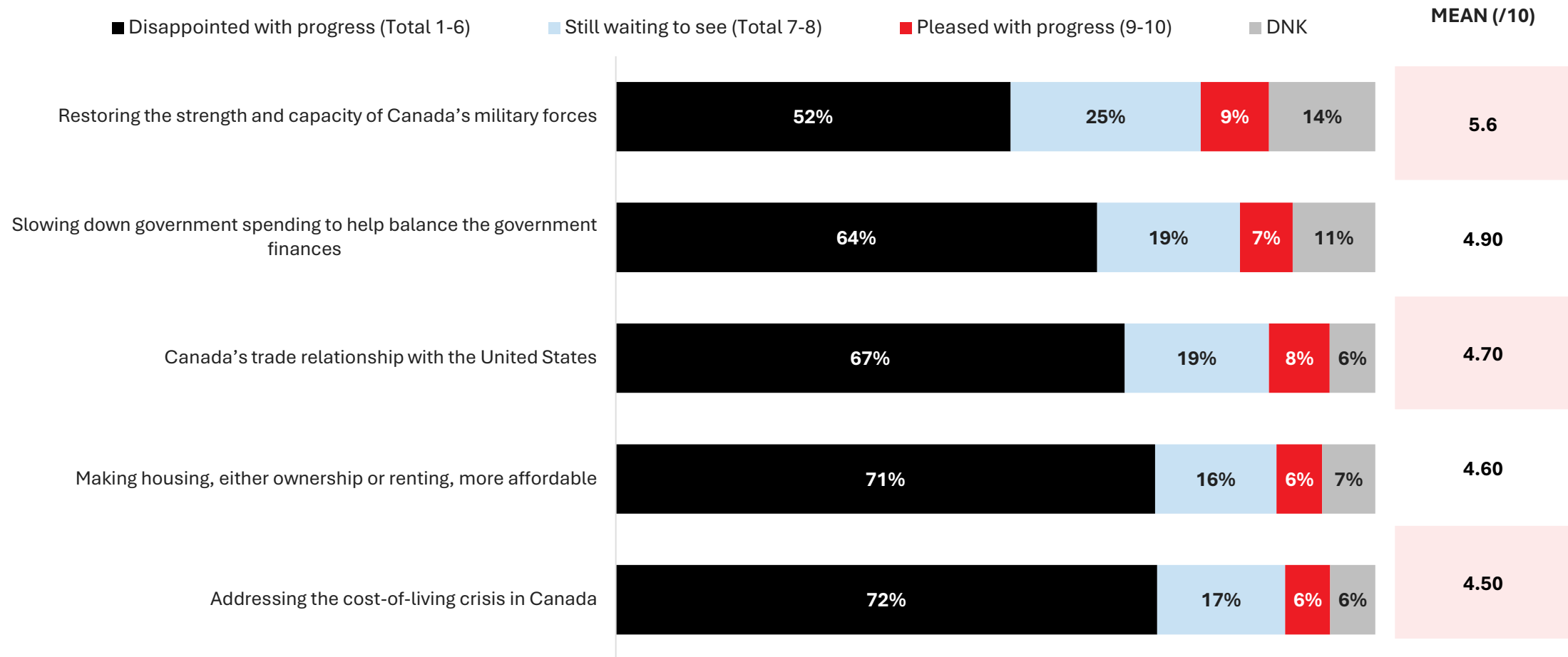

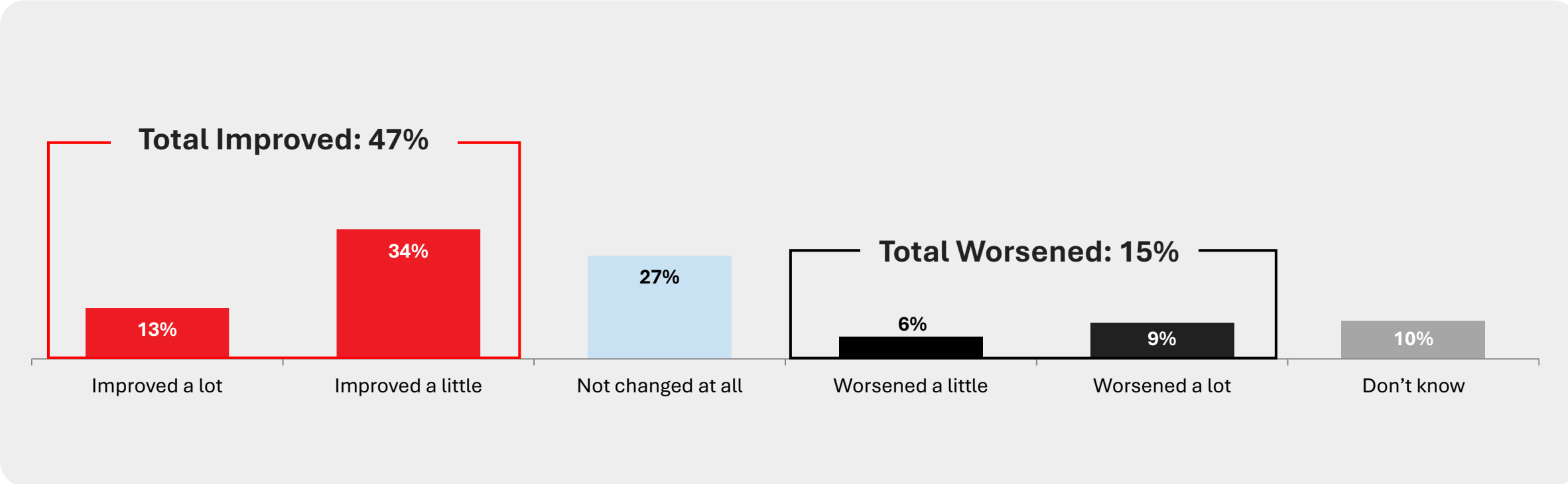

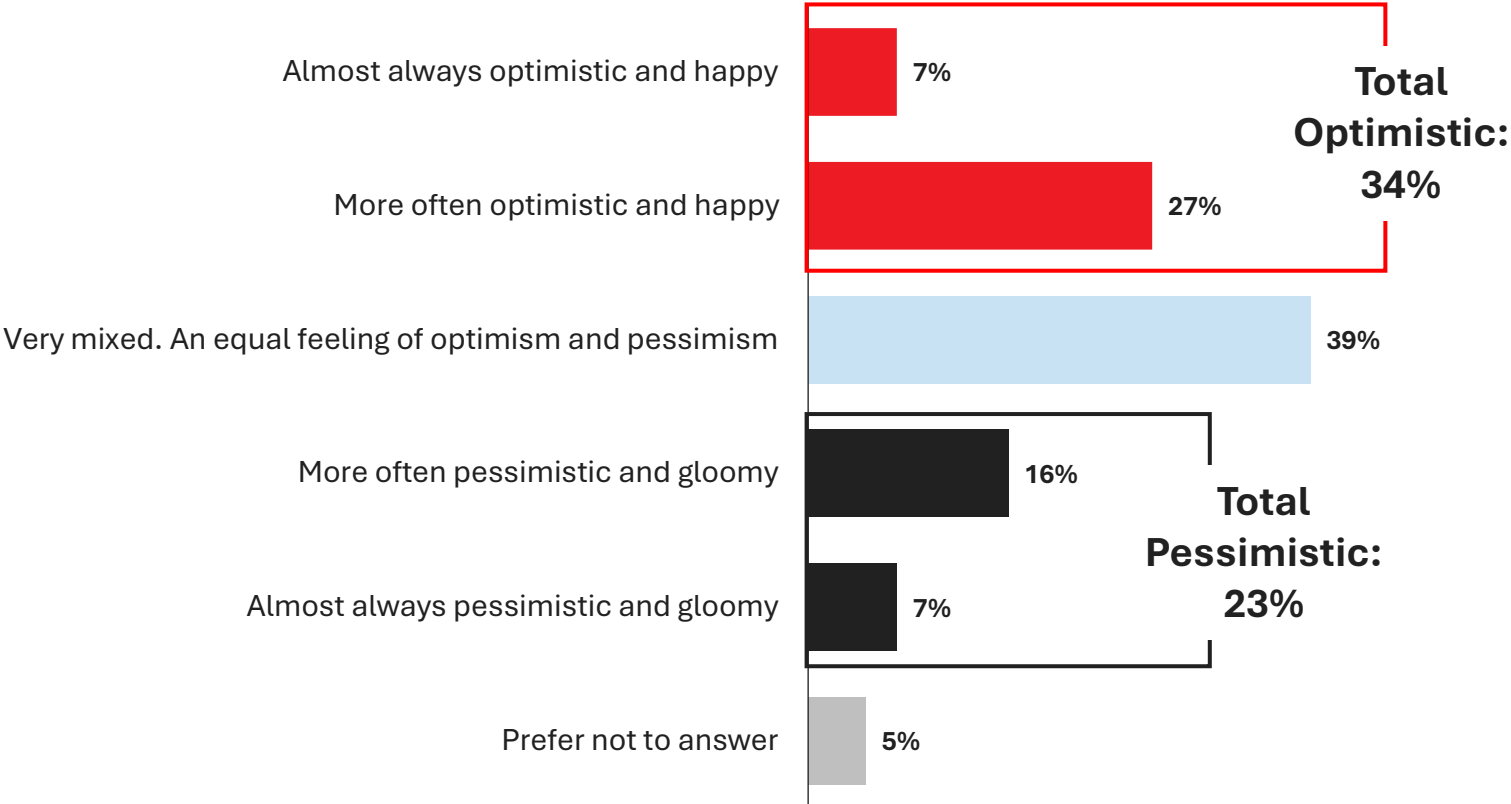

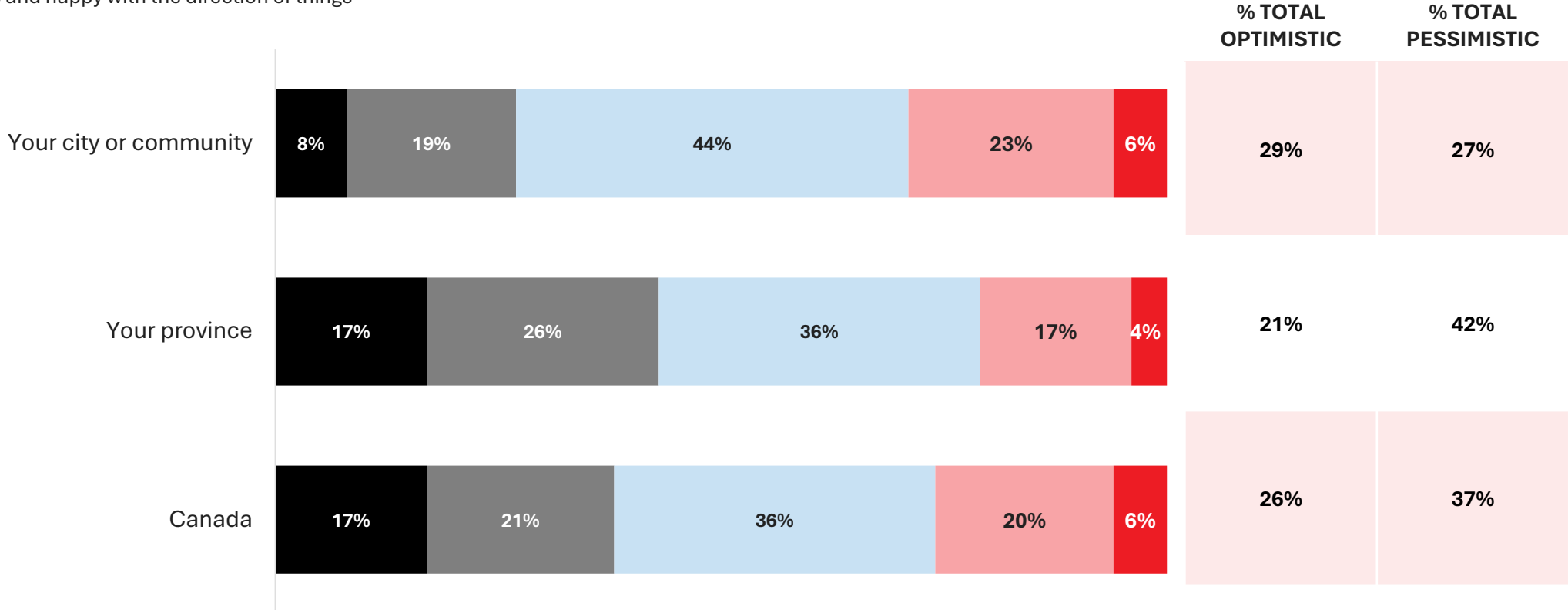

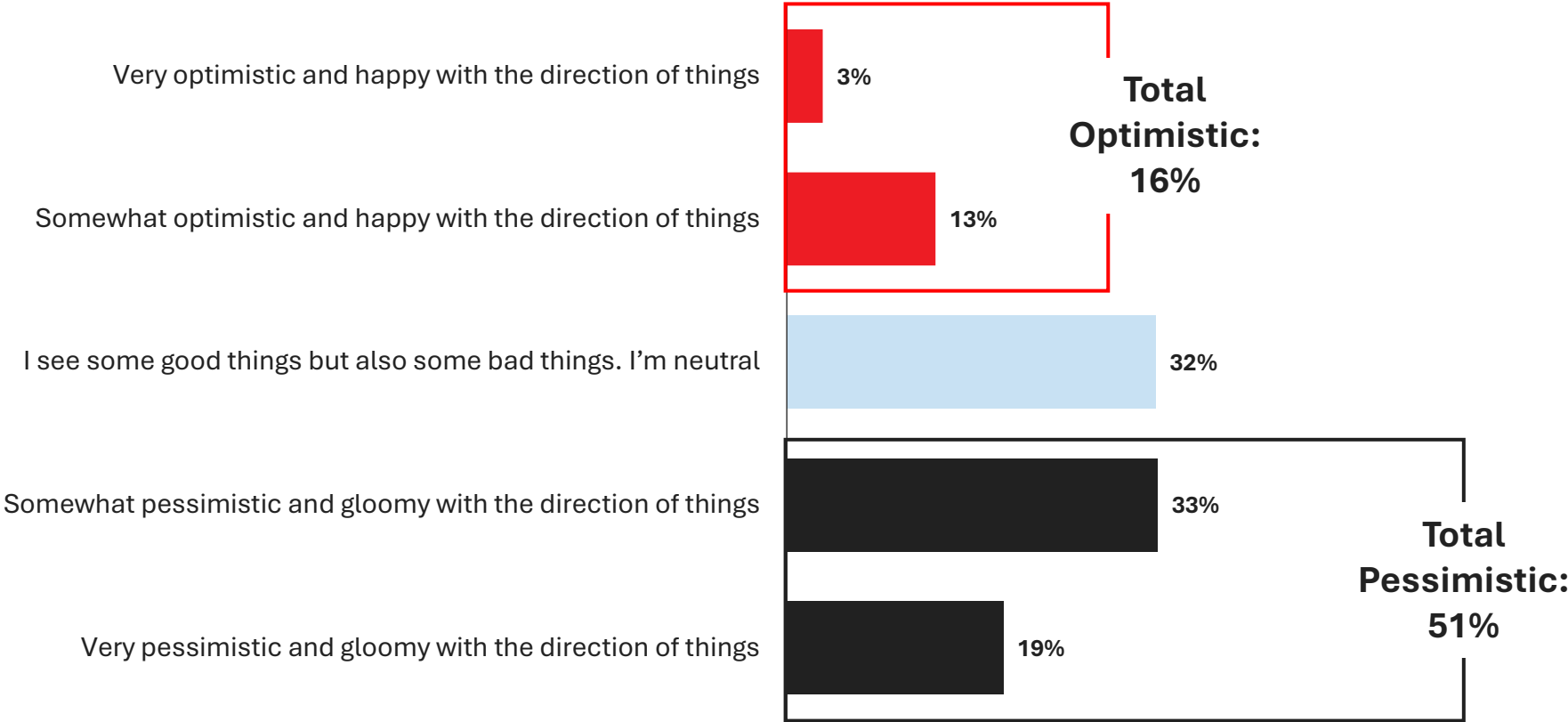
